Many Items of Interest To Rochester Catholics.

John P. Doyle of Elmira spent a few days in the city this week.

Rev. J. J. Donnelly of Victor, delivered an eloquent discourse on St. Patrick Sunday evening last at St. Bridget's church.

A slight fire in St. Peter and Paul's church, resulting from an overheated furnace, was extinguished Tuesday without any damage.

W. C. Dougherty of 115 Franklin street, who is about to remove to Detroit was surprised Monday night by a number of his friends, who called to bid him farewell.

William Purcell has been re-elected president of the board of managers of the State Industrial school; Martin Barron will serve on the executive building and repair and salary committees.

John Finucan of Pittsford Monday received a handsome specimen of the real shamrock from the old sod in the town of Tarbert, county Kerry, Ireland, sent him by his mother.

Messrs Herman and Frank Pohl, sons of the popular organist at SS Peter and Paul's church are studying at the College of Music, Cincinnati, O.

On Sunday, April 13th, a two faults' mission will open at Corpus Christi church. It will be conducted by two Lazarist Fathers from Germantown, Pa., probably Rev. Frank O'Donoghue.

Monday evening a meeting of citizens interested in reforming the state schools was held. In the course of the session, O. H. Stevens, of the Eighth ward, took occasion to denounce the present system of state schools as "godless and thoroughly sectarian."

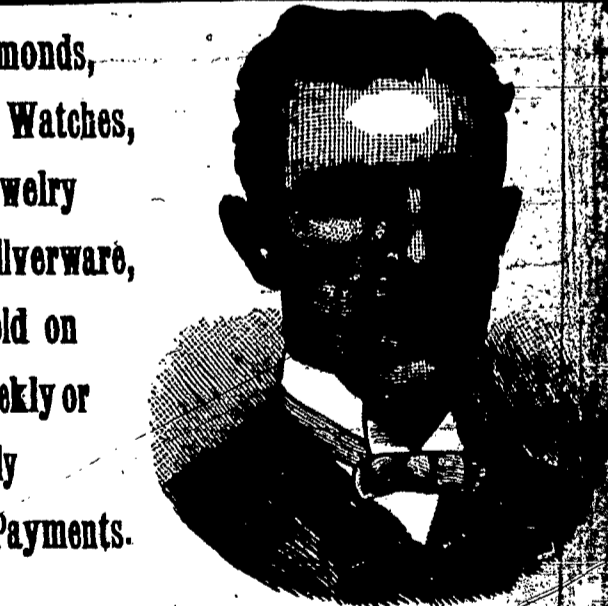
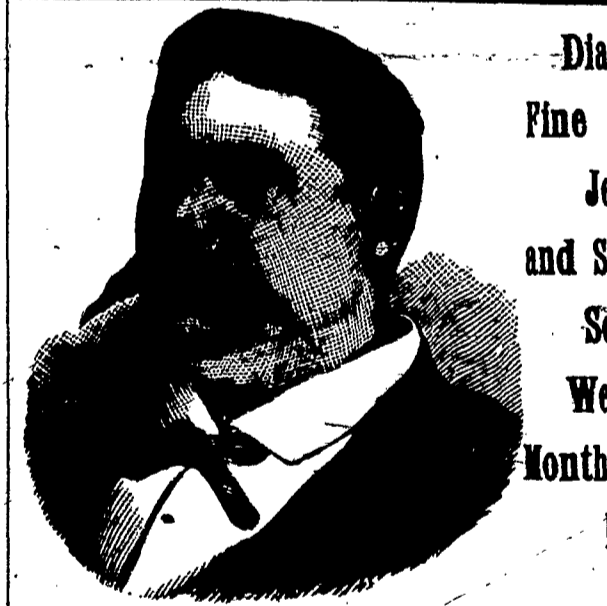
