Wednesday morning's session was called to order at 10 a. m. by President York. The constitution was thoroughly discussed and a new one adopted. The principal change from the former one was in fixing the date for the annual meeting on the third Tuesday of July.

Wednesday afternoon Bishop Ludden and Vicar-General Lynch visited the convention and were warmly welcomed.

Officers were elected as follows: State President, Bernard J. York of Brooklyn; Vice Pres., Eugene J. Mack of Syracuse; State Sec'y, Victor J. Dowling of New York.
