

June 15. Mr. Claude Guinness, the managing director of Messrs. Guinness and Co., Limited, directed the heads of the various départments in the James' Gate Brewery to announce to all the mechanics and laborers, both men and boys, employed in the concern that the directors had decided to increase their wages by one shilling a week There are 2,550 persons employed in the brewery who will receive the increase, which will mean an additional expenditure in wages of nearly £7.000 per annum. The directors state that the increase has been granted because of the increased prosperity of the brewery. The announcement was received by the employes, who had made no application whatever, most gratefully, and came as a very pleasant suprise to all of them.


