The Temple of Inca.

A correspondent writes from Peru to The Germania that the remains of a temple, dating back from the period of the Incas, have been discovered while clearing the ground for a small place on one of the affluents of the upper Marañon, in the great plain which lies at the foot of the eastern Cordilleras.

Hence it is inferred that this also was a similar temple. Several buildings of this kind have been found scattered over Peru. The Spaniards demolished them and floods bearing quantities of sand from the Cordilleras covered over the remains, to be succeeded later by a growth of shrubs, and even trees, quite hiding from view the masonry underneath.
