



The considerations upon which this resolution was passed were held not to contravene the original position of Mr. Webster, shared also by President Fillmore. The right to judicial remedy which Mr. Webster assured to the Spanish subjects likewise assured to the Italian subjects. The right is specially guaranteed the second section of the third article of the constitution. And, as Mr. Webster points out, the resident alien has a privilege which is denied to the citizen. The widows and children of the citizens who lost their lives by mob violence may sue the leaders and members of the mol only in the courts of the state of Louisiana, while the widows and children of the Italian subjects who suffered death have the right to sue each member of the mob. not only in the state courts, but also before the federal tribunals for the district of Louisiana

"Article 2314.—Every act whatever of man that causes damage to another. obliges him by whose fault it happened to repair it, the right of this action shall survive, in case of death, in favor of the minor children and willow of the deceased. or eitner of them, and in default of these. in favor of the surviving father or mother, or either of them, for the space of one year from the death."

Article 2316.-Every person is responsible for the damage he occasions, not merely by his act, but by his negligence. his imprudence, or his want of skill. Article 2324.—He who causes another person to do an unlawful act, or assists or encourages in the commission of it, is answerable in solido with that person for

the damage caused by such act.
