WE ARE NOT ALARMED.

Several friends of the JOURNAL have informed us during the past week, that our course in giving expression to our views on the paid organizer question will eventually injure this paper. We are sorry that any members of the association should desire to wreak vengeance on others because difference of opinion exists in regard to an act of the Grand officers. We regret that any brother should show such a petty, childish spirit; but our course will not be changed, even if such a spirit is manifested. We have expressed our opinion of the action of the Grand Board of Trustees, and we have invited other members to do the same. These columns have been open to those who regard the appointment in a favorable light, as well as to those who oppose it. Is the position of the former class so weak that they must resort to threats instead of arguments to sustain it?

What criticisms we have made, either through these columns or elsewhere, have been made openly. We have been and are now opposed to the appointment and to the manner in which it was made. We have not sought to shirk responsibility for our part in arousing the members to protest against it; nor will we. Nevertheless, we have respected the opinions of those who differed from us in the matter. We have believed it possible for men to hold different opinions and yet be united in bonds of strong, manly friendship. We have not maintained that men who dislike the appointment should stop buying merchandise of those who favor it, nor that members should only seek legal advice from lawyers who protest against a paid organizer.

It would be far more pleasant to refrain from commenting on the appointment; but there are times when the most pleasant course is not the most conscientious, and 'tis better to break with every friend on earth rather than preserve friendship by acting the coward's part.

The father of a family in moderate circumstances ought to have his life insured. This is a duty that he owes to his wife and children. The premiums cost comparatively little, while the security that they purchase may be inestimable. No man can tell how long he will live, how soon he will be cut down by death, to what straits his widow and orphans may be pushed by indigence. He lies under obligation to make all possible provision for the support of these dependent upon him. There are numerous Catholic mutual life insurance associations like the Catholic Knights of America, the Catholic Benevolent Legion, the Emerald Mutual Beneficial Association, and the Catholic Knights of Ohio, in which insurance can be gotten at low cost, and there are regular companies that are trustworthy and fair. No excuse is there for a husband who can insure his life and will not.

The Telegraph should have added the C. M. B. A. to the list and its advice would be beyond criticism.

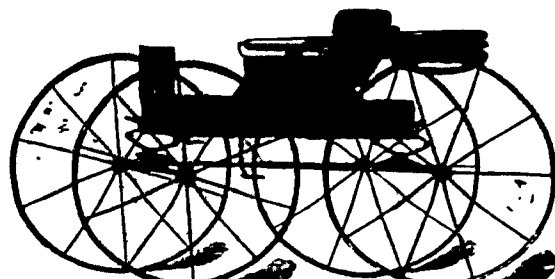
