THE WORLD'S DOINGS AS GLEANED FROM THE WIRES.

Pointed Paragraphs Containing All Interesting Events of the Week - A Pleasing Intermixture of Crimes, Accidents, Sensations, Business, Commerce and Finance.

American competition skating records from 6 to 10 miles were broken by A. D. Smith and Ed. Pannell in a 10-mile race in St. Paul, Minn. taking the race in 48:34, which is over a minute better than the best previous competitive record held by Joe Donoghue.

The quarterly report of the Wagner Palace Car company was filed at Albany. It shows gross earnings, \$1,199,930; expenses, \$818,142.

The grand jury found no indictments against the laborers who forced the South Dakota company to discontinue work under reduced wages scale by raising its camp on Annie creek.

Fourteen cases of smallpox are reported at the county hospital, Edwardsville, Ill. A tramp, who brought the disease, is dead.

Hon. William C. Whitney of New York has resigned as a delegate to the constitutional convention.

At San Francisco Dr. Eugene F. West, who was recently convicted of the murder of Adelle Gilmore, a Colusa milliner, upon whom he performed a criminal operation, appeared in court and was sentenced to 2 1/2 years in the state prison.

The 31 convicts who have been convicted of robbing at Mansfield and Burlington, Pa., were taken to the penitentiary and workhouse to serve out their sentences. Of the 31, five were taken to the penitentiary and the others to the workhouse.

Henry, the French anarchist, confessed that he was the author of the explosion which took place in the Hue des Bons Enfants in November, 1893.

By a vote of 81 to 6, the provincial legislature of Manitoba has declined the proposed memorial to abolish the office and emoluments of lieutenant governor as now existing.

Customs Collector Saunders at Port Townsend, Wash., has seized a small steamer from Victoria with eight Chinamen on board. The Chinamen were being smuggled into the United States.

The Massachusetts grand jury has brought in indictments against Attorney General Ellis, Secretary of State Jocelyn, Treasurer Hamilton, Land Commissioner Berry and Clerks Warren, Potter and Bussey on various charges of participation in the state salaries frauds.

The heirs of the late Captain Ward of Detroit divided his \$9,000,000 at a dinner given in Paris by his daughter, the beautiful, eccentric Princess Chimay.

A British steamer was routed by slavers on the west coast of Africa, with, perhaps, a heavy loss of life.

In Pike county, Ark., John Wert, a farmer, his wife and five children all perished in the flames of their burning house.

In a Harlem (N. Y.) conflagration one man was burned to death, a woman jumped from a window to the ground, breaking both ankles, another leaped into a tree and several children were safely thrown to the firemen below.

The Princess Colonna made a statement in which she announced that she intended to apply to the San Francisco courts for an annulment of her marriage.

Ex-Congressman H. B. Straits, who for 19 years represented Minnesota in the lower house at Washington, died on a Mexican Central train in Texas.

An expedition organized by Walter Follan will start for the North Pole via Norway and Spitzbergen within two weeks.

Henry W. Inohne, the New York hoodlum alderman, has been restored to citizenship by Governor Flower.

Charles A. Cline, sheriff of New York county, N. Y., died of pleuro-pneumonia, following a severe attack of the grip.

A society has been formed in New York to secure employment for poor Italian laborers and end the tyranny of the padrones.

Several important changes in the constitution were made by the Intercollegiate Athletic association.

Tenaglyphs, the Honduras capital, has fallen and President Vasquez is a fugitive. Polycarp Bonilla will undoubtedly succeed him.

Charles Hoyt, the playwright, denies he attempted to take an actress from Harrison, or that he has plagiarized the latter's plays.

B. S. De Garmendia defeated Phil Sears in the final game for the court tennis championship.

The Canadian Liberals claim to have a big sensation in store for the next session of the Dominion parliament and intimate that charges will be brought against members of the cabinet of similar character to those brought against the last postmaster general.

After a conference, Secretaries Herbert and Lamont have decided that there shall be no football contests between the cadets at Annapolis and West Point.

Governor Flower has signed chapter 56 providing for a public park in the city of New York.

Burns, Silver & Co. of New York filed a certificate of increase of capital from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

William Collins Meredith, ex-chief justice of the Canada supreme court, is dead.

The Paterson (N. J.) silk weavers decided that they would have no general strike and would make no demands upon their employers.

A cablegram received by Secretary Herbert from Admiral Benham at Rio, states that he had transferred his flag from the San Francisco to the New York. The purpose was to allow the San Francisco to go outside of the harbor for fresh air.

John S. Johnson, the champion skater, broke the world's record on the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association's quarter-mile track. He went ten miles in 31 minutes, 11 1/2 seconds, against Norenberg's 37 minutes, 37 seconds, the previous world's record, made at St. Petersburg.

Myron M. Parker, the Republican member of the board of commissioners for the District of Columbia, has resigned on account of ill-health.

Judge Brantano, who has been criticized for fixing the execution of the murderers, Fredenberg and Higgins, on Good Friday, said in an interview that he intended no derogation for church traditions. It was an accident that that date was elected, he said, and the day of the execution may get be changed.

ALBANY LEGISLATURE.

Principal Business Transacted in Senate and House.

ALBANY, Feb. 27.—The senate was in session when the senate met at 10 o'clock. Senators Reynolds, O'Brien and others were absent.

Routine business only was transacted. Bills introduced: Senator Appleton's bill to amend the laws relating to the punishment of a witness who refuses to testify, prepared by the state, by a witness commission.

Senator Saxton's amendment to the law by providing that public officers may be in evidence proof of retraction in mitigation of damages for libel.

Senator Sullivan, Mr. Grant's assembly bill regulating telephone charges throughout the state.

The assembly attended only to routine business.

Among the bills of general interest sent to a third reading were Mr. Sulzer's bill for a bail reform and Mr. Kern's, allowing interest in certain cases on board of claims awards.

Bills of general interest passed were: Mr. Almsworth's, regulating the formation of school commissioners' districts in cities having a board of education.

Mr. Porter's, authorizing the common council of the city of Rome to build a city hall and issue bonds therefor.

Bills of general interest introduced were: Mr. Robertson's, providing that no machinery shall be used to manufacture goods in prisons that are intended to be sold.

ALBANY, Feb. 28.—Among the bills reported in the assembly this morning are the following: Mr. Finnegans, amending the stock corporation law by permitting a court of record to grant an order requiring the corporation to permit a stockholder to examine any book of the corporation at any time during business hours and make extracts therefrom.

Mr. Tilton's, to enable towns to use any automatic voting machine that the town boards of such towns may provide, reported adversely.

J. H. Clark, allowing Niagara Falls a scale of weights and measures, city attorney and chief of police and fixing salaries.

Mr. Almsworth's, exempting cities of less than 50,000 inhabitants from the plumbers' registration act.

Mr. Almsworth's, securing for witnesses testifying before the special committee of the senate, appointed by resolution Jan. 30, 1894, immunity from indictment and punishment.

Epworth League Meeting. SPOKANE, O., Feb. 28.—The general cabinet of the Epworth league met here for two days' session.

Peach Crop Nearly Ruined. KINGSTON, N. Y., Feb. 28.—The cold snap is believed to have killed the peach buds along the Hudson. Anything like a peach crop in the Hudson river valley this season is not now expected.

Well-known Astronomer Dead. SOUTH NORWALK, Conn., Feb. 28.—Professor Knutson, the well-known astronomer, aged 77 years, has died here.
