CONNAUGHT.

LEINSTER.

GALWAY.

An agrarian dispute occurred at a place called Lough George, Galway, the disputants being the members of two families named respectively Connolly and Casserly. A man of the Connolly party struck one of his opponents on the head with a pitchfork, and the blow was fatal. Connolly has been arrested.

At the last meeting of the Galway Board of Guardians, Mr. Thomas McDonagh, J.P., in the chair, the following resolution, proposed by Mr. J. O. McDonnell, and seconded by Mr. James Donohoe, was carried unanimously:—"That we, the Galway Board of Guardians, representing the views of the ratepayers of this Union, condemn in the strongest terms the action of the House of Lords in rejecting the Evicted Tenants Bill. We regard this action of the Lords as being calculated to be far-reaching in its evil effects, and think it is time for the people of this country to voice their opinions and repudiate the action of those hereditary legislators and haters of Ireland and her people."

LIMERICK.

At a late meeting of the Bawnboy Board of Guardians attention was drawn to the fact that there were no Roman Catholic magistrates in the districts of Belturbet, Blackloyn, and Bawnboy, and a resolution was adopted recommending Dr. P. J. Bonaghan, Belturbet; and Messrs. John Phillips, Airmount, Bawnboy; James McGauran, Gortahill, Blackloyn; R. W. Hamilton, Downs; Alfred Griffith, Lodge, Belturbet, as fit and proper persons to receive the Commission of the Peace for the County of Limerick, and Messrs. James Pakenham, Carrigallen, and Bernard Keane, Ballinamore, for the county of Leitrim.

MAYO.

That misfortune never comes single is proved too sadly true in the sorrowful news of the death of two grown-up children of Michael Giblin, of Streamstown, Rosbeg. Sarah Adna, the eldest, was a girl of good education, and a general favorite among her school companions. She emigrated while young, to America, where she spent twelve years, during which time she never forgot her parents' home in Ireland. The poor girl caught cold, was attended several times by doctors, whose final prescription was a change to her native air. She came home, and after a lingering illness of fourteen months duration died at the age of 29 years. Michael, her brother, after a short illness, was also called by Almighty God to accompany his saintly sister to their heavenly home at the age of 13 years. Both are now lying buried, side by side, in the old churchyard of Aghawell.

ROSCOMMON.

A sheep belonging to Mr. George James, Sub-Sheriff, was killed by a dog outside the town of Roscommon. The dog which belonged to Mrs. Connolly, of Crubhill, was shot.

John Cooney, Sub-Sheriff's bailiff, put up for sale two cows belonging to Thomas Mullen, seized under a civil bill decree for half a year's interest of purchase money, at the suit of Clara Mar Nolan and Kate Nolan; and the cows were purchased for £9 by James Mullen.

SLIGO.

The Lord Chancellor has appointed Mr. Peter S. Kilgallon, of Grangebeg, Sligo, to the Commission of the Peace for the county of Sligo. The appointment has given the highest satisfaction to every one who knows Mr. Kilgallon.

Owing to the tempestuous nature of the weather lately, the potato crop has made considerable headway in the Sligo district and the same is elsewhere.

Dr. R. O'Callaghan, formerly Surgeon of the Carlow County Infirmary, has been appointed to the Chelsea Hospital for Women.

DUBLIN.

The latest subscriptions acknowledged in the Dublin Freeman raise the Irish Parliamentary Fund to five thousand pounds.

At the Brighton, England, Bankruptcy Court, an application to adjudge Mrs. Catherine O'Shea Farnell bankrupt was formally adjourned, it being stated that the composition promised had been paid since the notice of application was filed.

A public meeting of the Inns Quay branch of the Irish National League and Registration Association was held at 68 O'Connell street, Dublin, to protest against the raising of the Lord Mayor's salary, and other matters affecting the Corporation.

Rev. Father Columbus, O.S.F.C., President of the League of the Cross has arrived home from Cardiff, Wales, where he has been attending the annual convention of the League.

Mr. J. F. Hogan, M.P., has left Dublin for a visit to Canada and Australia.

KILKENNY.

After a visit of eight months to his native land, Mr. Oliver T. Timothy, son of the late Mr. Wm. Timothy, has left Kilkenny for his native home. It has been upwards of twenty years since Mr. Timothy first left Kilkenny. Mr. Timothy spent a month on the Continent, visiting many places of historic interest in France, Germany, Switzerland and Belgium.

LOUTH.

The dedication of the new church raised upon the historic site of Monasterboice will take place early in October.

Cardinal Logue has appointed Rev. B. Donnellan, C.C., Kilsaran, as successor of the late Father Fox, O.C., Dundalk; and the Rev. N. Lawless, C.C., Lordship, to succeed Rev. Father Donnellan as curate of Kilsaran.

At the annual election of Harbor Commissioners for Drogheda, the following gentlemen were returned: Bernard Nulty, Peter Lynch, Michael Collins, John McEvoy, Henry Smythe, Sylvester Roche, Patrick Morgan, J. P. Kelly, Joseph O'Kelly, Alderman C. Tighe and James Sampson.

MEATH.

It has been decided by the Irish Agricultural Society to make the experiment of establishing agricultural banks at Summerhill, county Meath, and at Doneraile, county Cork.

James Bashford, of Syddon, in the of Meath, grocer, has been declared bankrupt.

QUEEN'S.

Mr. O'Neil Ferguson Kelly, District, R.I.C., Mountrath, has been transferred to Wexford, vice Mr. Maxwell, who replaces him in Mountrath.

WESTMEATH.

Mr. Richard O'Brien Smyth, C. Es., Local Government Board Inspector, held an inquiry in the Town Hall, Athlone, with reference to the application of the Local Sanitary Authority for sanction to a loan of £200 for the purpose of relaying gas mains. It was shown that the existing gas mains were very old and out of repair, and required relaying. This would be of great benefit to the town. Several witnesses having been examined in support of the application, and there being no opposition the inquiry terminated.

WEXFORD.

An unmarried woman of advanced years named Irwin, residing close to Larkin's cross, Wexford, died sud-

denly the other day. It is stated that she suffered from heart disease.

A woman named Margaret Doyle, or Kelly, was brought before the Magistrate, charged with being a dangerous lunatic, and was committed to the asylum.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. Wm. Hayes, North Main street, Wexford, after a brief illness.

At the Dominican Convent of the Sacred Heart, Oakford, near Verulam, Natal, South Africa, the profession of three novices took place:— Sister Margaret Mary Alaouque Murphy, Sister Mary Paula Murphy, and Sister Mary Reginald Horan, three of the postulants whom Rev. Mother Gabriel brought with her to Natal, on her return from Ireland nearly two years ago.

WICKLOW.

Mr. Wakefield, chief locomotive engineer of the Dublin, Wicklow and Wexford Railway Company, has resigned, and Mr. Grierson, C.E., engineer-in-chief, will have charge of the locomotive department as well as the permanent way.

MUNSTER.

CORK.

At a late meeting of the Kanturk Board of Guardians, Mr. Buckley, Dalry, presiding, the following resolution, proposed by Mr. J. Collins, vice-chairman, and seconded by Mr. Wm. Vaughan, was unanimously adopted:—"That we look upon the action of the House of Lords, in connection with the Evicted Tenants Restoration Bill, as of the greatest danger to the Constitution, and a clear proof of the absolute necessity of Home Rule for Ireland, rendering the task of the representative chamber useless for any legislative beneficial to the country, and nothing short of an incentive to rebellion. That we pledge ourselves now, as ever, to support the evicted tenants until restored to their homes. That we feel grateful to the present government for their good intentions to our country, and that we call on all the representative bodies in Ireland to speak out and condemn the unwarrantable action of the House of Landlords in this vital matter to Ireland."

KERRY.

The High Sheriff of Kerry (Mr. J. D. Crosbie) and Mrs. Crosbie, have returned home after their honeymoon, and were made the recipients of an extremely warm reception by a very large concourse of people, headed by the band of the Total Abstinence Society. The party arrived from Limerick by train, and as they passed out to the carriage in waiting, they were heartily cheered. The band, accompanied by a large crowd, then proceeded to Gurtanard, where an address of welcome was read from the Temperance Society, of which Mr. Crosbie is a very warm patron. The reception on the whole was most flattering, and was a remarkable demonstration of the esteem and kindly feeling in which the High Sheriff is held by the people of Listowel and North Kerry.

LIMERICK.

At Murroe, the cattle of two orphan girls named Hayes, tenants of Sir Charles Barrington, have been seized by the sheriff and sold to satisfy the landlord's claim of only one year's rent. Mr. John Barrington, agent of the property, attended the sale.

A warm scene occurred at the last meeting of the Croom Board of Guardians relative to the tenancy of a laborer's cottage. Mr. P. Ryan, Solicitor, Charleville, wrote, threatening the Guardians with legal proceedings, on the part of a laborer named Daniel Jordan, if they placed another laborer named James Murphy, in possession of a cottage, it being alleged that Murphy was a resident of the Newcastle Union. It was shown that Murphy had been waiting three years in the Croom Union, when his house fell down and he was obliged to take shelter across the road. He was declared tenant.

At a meeting of the Abbeyfeale Evicted Tenants, held lately, it was unanimously resolved:—"That we view with alarm the attitude of the House of Lords with regard to the Evicted Tenants Bill; that we have waited patiently for years in great suffering, deprived of valuable property; to which we are justly entitled, but in the possession of which, owing to defects in the law, we were not protected; that we look to the present Government and Legislature to redress our grievances; and, that we now appeal to them with confidence."
