Short Items of Interest From all Parts of the Catholic World.

Religious Happenings Presented in Condensed Form.

The cardinal archbishop of Paris, with the approval of his holiness, is about to undertake the restoration of the shrine of the blessed Virgin at Loreto.

The anniversary of the dedication of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Boston, was celebrated on Sunday, Sept. 22d.

The Congregation of Rites has taken another step in the process of beatification of the venerable Louise de Marillac, co-foundress of the Sisters of Charity, by deciding that there was nothing contrary to faith in her writings.

The Rev. P. J. Hurth, O.S.O., formerly professor at Notre Dame University, Ind., and latterly president of St. Edward's College, Aurora, Texas, has been appointed to the bishopric of Deacon, East Bengal, India.

A statue of Joan of Arc, whom the Church has lately declared venerable, was unveiled at Domremy, her native place, in the presence of over twenty thousand pilgrims.

The Archdiocese of Dublin alone contributed this year the splendid sum of \$20,000 to the annual and always generous collection in Ireland for the Pope.

Cardinal Rampolla has written a letter to Abbe Naudet, the French clergyman who devotes his life to the improvement of the condition of the working classes. The Cardinal expresses the Pope's satisfaction with priests who devote themselves to the solution of the labor question.

A scheme which has been under discussion for thirty years has practically matured to build a Roman Catholic cathedral in London on a site in Westminster purchased by the late Cardinal Manning for \$250,000. The total cost of the edifice is estimated at over a million dollars, and the whole of Catholic christendom will be invited to subscribe.

A historic English estate will soon be sold by auction. It once belonged to Archbishop Thomas A' Becket, was resided at by Edward II and Edward III, and the kings of France and Scotland, prisoners of Edward III, lived there. The estate is called Clarendon Park, and is near Salisbury.

Up to the present, the two Popes, who, since 1788, have lived the longest are Clement XII, who had reached the age of 92 when he died, and Paul IV, who was elected when he had reached the advanced age of 88 years, and occupied the chair of Peter up to the advanced age of 98; Gregory IX. was almost a centenarian when he died in 1241.

One of the fruits of the Holy Father's Encyclical on unity is the conversion of a Methodist minister in Rome. The Rev. Mr. Fisher, pastor of the American Methodist Church in that city, has been received into the Catholic Church, and it is said that the Pope's letter was the immediate cause of his conversion.

The Congregation of Rites has issued a decree about music in the Catholic service, urging reliance upon the Gregorian chant as mainstay, severely forbidding the use of profane music, especially if it be inspired by theatrical motives, variations or reminiscences, and also putting under the ban fantasies on the organ by such as are not capable of doing it with decorum and in a way calculated to foster the piety of the faithful.

The present is not the first American pilgrimage that has visited the famous French shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes. Twenty years ago the lamented James A. McMaster, it is asserted, organized a pilgrimage to

the same sanctuary and succeeded in inducing over 100 persons to embark in the enterprise. The late Bishop Dwyer of the Fort Wayne diocese and the well-known Jesuit, Father Dealy, accompanied these first pilgrims.

Mgr. Satelli, the Apostolic Delegate, desires to maintain silence as to the latest statement regarding him that the Pope will soon make his authority absolute and sovereign, even above the College of Cardinals, and answerable only to the Holy Father himself. Mr. Satelli has given instructions to those at his residence not to admit reporters or permit any cards of newspaper men to be taken to him or to Dr. Fagi, his private secretary. This action, taken in connection with his rule to allow no person's card to be taken to him at his residence after noon on any day, makes it almost impossible to gain any authentic information concerning his action.

The spiritual care of the Holy Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, N. Y., is to be placed in the hands of the Salesians, whose mother house is in Baltimore. The members of the Society of St. Joseph have been famous the world over for more than two centuries and a half as educators. The society of St. Joseph was founded in France in 1641 by Father Olier, having been named after the parish of St. Joseph in Lyons. The special object of the order is the education of young men in the sciences and letters. In 1791 the first American Salesian arrived in this country and settled in Baltimore. In 1840 they came to New York and St. Mary's seminary in this city.
