

CRISP NEWS ITEMS.

HISTORY IN BRIEF OF THE WEEK'S HAPPENINGS.

Interesting News From All Parts of the Globe—Press Dispatches and Shorter News Items Presented in Convenient Form For Readers Whose Time Is Limited.

A regiment of infantry, a squadron of cavalry and a battery of artillery has embarked from Lisbon for additional reinforcements to the troops already at Lourenço Marques, Delagoa Bay.

Two weeks ago Frederick Casack and Thomas Clark took a boat from Toronto and have not been seen since. They took two guns and a roll of blankets and said they would return the following day.

A banquet was given by Emperor William at Berlin to the guests who had attended the ceremony of consecrating the flags of the new battalion.

The Mutual Gas and Electric company has been incorporated with a capital of \$100,000 to supply the city of Brooklyn with gas and electricity.

The Prince of Wales has presented the Royal Yacht club with 21 brass cannon bearing the name of William IV, with which to fire salutes.

Sir R. T. Reid has been appointed attorney general of Great Britain in succession to Baron Russell of Kilowen.

The widow of President Hayes has declined the proposed grant from the republic of Columbia of the sum of \$100,000 as a token of the country's appreciation of the services which her husband rendered to Columbia.

The Brooklyn, Newtown and Bowers Bay Railroad company was incorporated to operate a street surface road in Newtown, Queens county, its terminal to be Poney Bridge, Lutheran Cemetery and Bowers Bay, North Beach. The capital stock is \$100,000.

The Utica (N. Y.) Belt Line Street Railroad company filed a certificate with the secretary of state of an abandonment of a certain portion of its line.

"Alaric," a play by General Verdy du Vernois, formerly Germany's minister of war, illustrating the struggles which resulted in United Germany, had its first performance in Berlin.

While casing a 2,000 foot gas well north of Shelbyville, Ind., some one struck a match to light his pipe. An explosion followed. Martin Archibald, Putnam McIntosh and Ed Tynor were fatally hurt. Several others were injured.

H. D. Hyde, president of the American Trust company of Boston, and N. W. Gordon, attorney for the company, will commence suit in the United States court for the foreclosure of the mortgage bonds of the Gulf road.

The steamer Drow of the Albany line ran ashore at Fort Washington Point. The passengers were landed safely and the baggage removed.

The factory of the American Biscuit and Manufacturing company at Fort Du Laus was destroyed by fire. Loss, \$100,000. Insurance, \$50,000.

Andrew Smith, a member of the firm of Smith Brothers, manufacturers of cough drops, has died at Poughkeepsie, N. Y. He was 63 years of age. Mr. Smith was known as a philanthropist through contributions to numerous charities.

E. E. Anderson of Boothsville, Ill., broke the world's class A bicycle record for 4 mile, unpaced, flying start. He made the distance in 20-4-5 seconds.

United States Marshal J. Adam Bedo gave out a copy of his letter to the attorney general tendering his resignation of the marshalship on account of the order forbidding federal employees to do campaign work.

Three owners of chloral taken with suicidal intent, and the life of one of the most famous musicians in the South, Linda Miller, at Knoxville, Tenn.

A dispatch from Shanghai states that negotiations for peace between China and Japan have been reopened.

Ex-Governor Joseph D. Bodie of New Jersey has died in St. Luke's hospital, New York. He was taken to the hospital on the 12th instant to have an operation performed.

East-bound shipments from Chicago last week amounted to 46,694 tons, against 47,338 for the preceding week and 64,291 for the corresponding week of last year. Shipments to the west amounted to 14,900 tons, against 150,368 for the preceding week.

The schooner Maggie and May arrived at Gloucester, Mass., lying her flag at half mast. Captain McEachern reported that two of the crew, Allen and McEachern, went ashore in a dory and were lost. This makes five fishermen reported lost in the past week.

The first general report and account of James B. Foley, as permanent receiver of the Order of Iron Hall, was filed in superior court at Indianapolis.

John Wald, an old resident of Cambridge City, Ind., shot himself and his 9-year-old son. Both will die. Family trouble is given as the cause of the act.

Captain Edgar C. Bowen, retired, has been detailed for service as professor of military science at St. Paul's school, Garden City, N. Y.

Surgeons at Catskill, N. Y., have successfully removed the right eye of Senator Bloodgood, who was injured while hunting on Oct. 12.

William G. Eckert, a tea agent aged 80, residing with his father-in-law in Albany, was arrested by Detectives Nolan and McCann for alleged grand larceny in New York city. Eckert asserts his innocence.

The Plattsburg Press was incorporated with a capital of \$3,000 to publish newspapers and other printed matter at Plattsburg, N. Y.

The British bark Woodbine, Captain Fowles, from New York, Sept. 1, for Parshyba, has been wrecked near Natal, Brazil.

Ex-Prime Minister Baron Blot of Sweden is dead.

Lourens & Son, wholesale diamond dealers of New York, were robbed of \$1,000 worth of diamonds by an unknown woman dressed in black.

The Great Lyons of Roubeaux and Paes, France, obtained an attachment in New York for \$28,000 against Florida Mayol and Achille Laine, two of the concern's former clerks who, it is alleged, absconded from Roubeaux, France, two weeks ago.

Dr. J. S. Irwin, surgeon of the marine hospital service at London, says there is a steady decrease in the cholera epidemic everywhere in Europe, amounting in the case of Austria-Hungary to nearly 50 per cent.

M'CLELLAN IN BRONZE.

Status of the General Presented to the City of Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 24.—The exercises at the unveiling of the bronze statue of General George B. McClellan, which was presented to the city by the McClellan Monument Association, took place today. The ceremonies began at 1 o'clock. General William F. (famously known as "Baldy") Smith, of this city, presided. The oration was delivered by General W. B. Franklin of Hartford, Conn. Major Moses Veale made the presentation speech and Mayor Stewart responded in behalf of the city.

Governor Pattison of Pennsylvania and Governor Abbott of New Jersey made addresses.

A procession, including the First and part of the Third brigade of the National Guard of Pennsylvania, together with troops from New York, New Jersey and Washington, various Grand Army organizations, the Grand College cadets, the Sons of Veterans and other organizations formed near Broad street and Susquehanna avenue, and marched down Broad street as far as Tasker, with a review at the place of the exercises.

Senator Brice's Comrades Meet. MANION, O., Oct. 24.—The 10th annual reunion of the One Hundred and Eighth regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry, will be held today and tomorrow in this city. Calvin S. Brice, United States senator, was captain of Company E of this regiment. The regiment was organized at Camp Chase, O., October 1864, for one year, and was mustered out the following July, 1865, owing to the close of the war.
