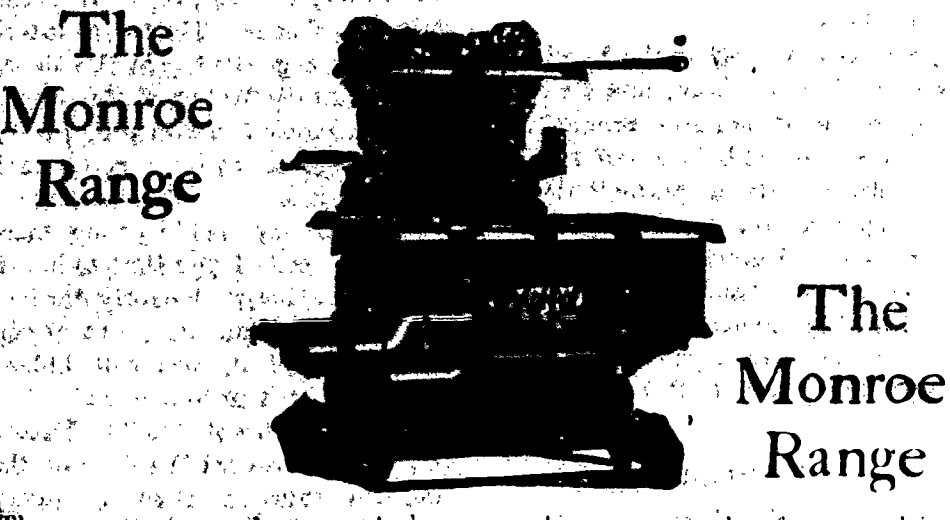

**EVOLUTION OF NIAGARA.**

The Estimates as to the Age of the World Famous Cataract.

Professor J. W. Spencer says the first conjecture as to the age of Niagara falls was made by Andrew Elliot in 1790. Elliot believed the falls to be 55,000 years old. About 1841 Lyle estimated the age of the falls as 85,000 years. All of these early estimates were purely conjectures, but they were correct in assuming that the gorge had been excavated by the river. Professor Spencer, in outlining the progress of the falls, says that a little stream draining the Erie basin once fell about 900 feet above the brow of the Niagara escarpment. This stream was not over one-fourth the volume of the recent cataract and consequently excavated the gorge at a much slower rate than at present.
