NEWS DOTS FROM IRELAND

Interesting Paragraphs Concerning the Doings of Our Friends Across the Ocean,

Gathered from All Parts of the Emerald Isle for Our Readers.

CONNAUGHT. LEINSTER.

GALWAY. The dead body of a sailor was recently washed ashore near the village of Bunowtag, ten miles from Clifden.

DUBLIN. A man named John McDonnell, aged 60 years, an employee of the Dublin Gas Company, was found unconscious, lying on the footpath outside his residence.

MAYO. It is understood that the Midland Great Western Railway Company will proceed at once with the erection of a hotel at Mulranny.

KILKENNY. Dr. Reginald E. Griffin has been appointed medical officer to the Constabulary in Kilkenny.

ROSCOMMON. Mr. James Galvin, Mount Talbot, recently arrived home from Colorado, where he spent the winter months.

SLIGO. Mr. James F. McGettrick, of the General Valuation Office, Dublin, Revising Valuer for the Sligo District, has been promoted by the Chief Commissioner of Valuation for Ireland to the important post of first valuer in the department.

LOUTH. At the meeting of the Drogheda Corporation, held recently, the Mayor (Mr. Nutty), presiding, a letter was read from the Lords of the Treasury, sanctioning a lease to the trustees of the Sisters of Charity, of a site for building purposes.

MEATH. A permanent branch of the Hibernian Bank has been opened in Oldcastle, and Mr. White, who for the last five years was manager of Balraghaderin, county Mayo, has been appointed to the management of the new branch.

QUEEN'S. The following have deposited petitions in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, in favor of the Central Ireland Railway Bill:—The Town Commissioners of Mullingar, the Town Commissioners of Mountmellick, and the Guardians of Mountmellick Union.

WESTMEATH. The Lord Chancellor has appointed Mr. Thomas Shaw, of La Mancha, Mullingar, to the Commission of the Peace for Westmeath.

WEXFORD. Laurence Ryan, Well lane, Wexford, cardriver, in the employment of the Imperial Hotel, died suddenly.

MUNSTER. CLARE. Before the Lord Chancellor, in Dublin, Mr. Robert W. Frost, of Six-milebridge, was admitted a solicitor of the Supreme Court of Judicature, in Ireland.

CORK. An order appears in the Dublin Gazette, directing that the Bridewell of Queenstown shall no longer be used as a Bridewell or prison.

KERRY. Waterville is becoming quite a busy place. There is a new hotel being built there, in addition to the excellent hotels the town can already boast of.

LIMERICK. Mr. Thomas B. Mitchell, of Ballybricken, Vice Chairman of the Limerick Board of Guardians, has, on the recommendation of Mr. T. G. O'Brien, Lieutenant of the county, been appointed to the commission of the peace for the county Limerick.

TIPPERARY. In the Exchequer Court, Dublin, before Justice Andrews, Mr. P. Law Smith applied for defendant, in the case of Anne Dwyer v. S. H. Reilly, to make a consent a rule of court.

WATERFORD. Mr. Edmond Power has served notice on his Tramore tenants, calling on them to pay up at once the half-year's rent due on the first of May.

ULSTER. ANTRIM. The police recently discovered that an illicit distillery was in working order in Greenland street, Belfast.

ARMAGH. An inquest was held recently before Mr. T. G. Peel, coroner, and a jury, touching the death of John Heenan, by cutting his throat.

DONEGAL. The Press Association learns that the total amount of money provided by Parliament for the construction of light railways in Ireland has been exhausted.

MONAGHAN. The inhabitants of Moneyglass, near Toomebridge, were thrown into a considerable state of alarm recently, when the bell attached to the local Catholic Church was loudly rung.

TYRONE. Intelligence reached Cookstown recently, that, on the Ballybriest Mountain, six miles off, a respectable farmer named Bernard Rogers, a man of about 90 years, was putting out his cattle, when a bull attacked him.

WATERFORD. It is reported that Armenia is arming and about to break into open revolt. If Armenia ever means to do any real hard fighting, it is about time that she set about it.

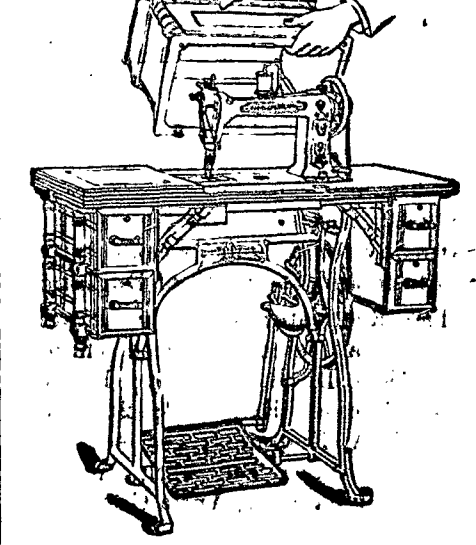
