A NEW COLLEGE

The Viaticum Carried Through th the Streets of Rome.

Another Riotous Scene in the Italian Parliament.

BOME ITALY One of the chief moans which the Holy Father uses in order to effect re-union with the East is the astablishment of Catholic Colleges. This means is no less secure than it is promptly put into effect. By it the youth of the east will be educated according to the right spirit and with apecial thought of coclesiastical unity. The imparting of such an education on the spot is another supreme advantage. The colleges established in the Best will become centres of Catholic truth while remaining fully in south with the national and local life of the Mastern people. In this they will serve a purpose which could not be realized by the Greek Colleges in Roma. These last are at a distance from the Ontholic diocess of the Mast, and can thus exercise but an indirect infixence on the schiematical todies. The promptness with which the Holy Father has proceeded with the establishment of these solleges to the Best is very remarkable. The plan of founding a great Catholic College at Constantinople is aiready well advanced, and now the Very Rev.
