The Lastare Medal, founded in 1888 by the University of Notre Dame to encourage Catholic laymon to battle ever for the truth, in the American counterpart of the Papel "golden rose." John Gilmary Shea, the historian of the churck in America was the first to receive the medal. This was in 1855. Patrick Keeley, the foremost Catholic architect of his time, was chosen, the following year, to wear the medal. Eliza Allen Starr, poet and arbist. was the third medallist: the fourth being General Newton, the great engiueer.

It is not set down in any book who was the medallist of the year 1887. The medal was awarded, but the man chosen by the trustees declared that he was unable to accept it.
