



This work is now to be performed by an official under judicial authority, who makes a list of names, which, by the provision of the act, must be at least 8,000. He examines them primarily for intelligence, but also for the regular qualifications of jurors. Each special juror shall have the following qualifications:

First.-He shall be a citizen of the United States of at least ten years' standing and a resident of the county. Second.—He shall be not less than 80 nor more than 70 years old.

Third.—He shall be in possession of his natural faculties and not infirm.

Fourth.—He shall be free from all legal exceptions, of good character, of approved integrity, intelligent, of sound judgment, able to read and write the English language understandingly, well informed, and he shall have an adequate knowledge of the duties of a juror.

The jurors shall be drawn by lot, but the trial court may, in its discretion, set aside a juror at any time before the trial is begun.
