GEN. RUZ WILL LEAVE FOR CUBA. ANOTHER EXPEDITION PREPARED.

Will Be Composed of "Staff Men" Physicians Will Go, Taking Instruments and Medicines With Them—Will Join General Antonio Maceo.

The Cuban patriots in New York, under the direction of General Estrada Palma, are now engaged in fitting out a secret expedition which is to start from that city for Cuba in a few days.

The expedition will differ from former expeditions sent out by the Cuban junta, inasmuch as every member will be a professional man. For former expeditions anybody anxious to carry arms against Spain was enlisted.

General Ruz is well known as a Cuban patriot. He was captured during the ten years' war and served a term of imprisonment in Spain.

About ten men who served on his staff during the ten years' war, and who are now in New York, will accompany their old leader to the front.

The managers of the junta are anxious to have General Ruz start as soon as possible. A swift steamer has been engaged, it is stated, and the patriots will board her probably at New York.

General Gomez, the commander in chief of the Cuban army in the field, in conversation with a correspondent a few months ago, stated that he did not want the junta to send men to Cuba.

The expedition under General Ruz will be the first made up exclusively of "staff men." Of course each member will be provided with a uniform, a .44 caliber revolver, a machete and a saddle.

General Ruz was seen yesterday by a reporter. The veteran revolutionist is a fine looking man and a thorough fighting member of the old school.

General Ruz acknowledged that he would leave for Cuba at an early date. Of course he declined to give the exact date of his departure or the name of the steamer which would carry him and his followers.

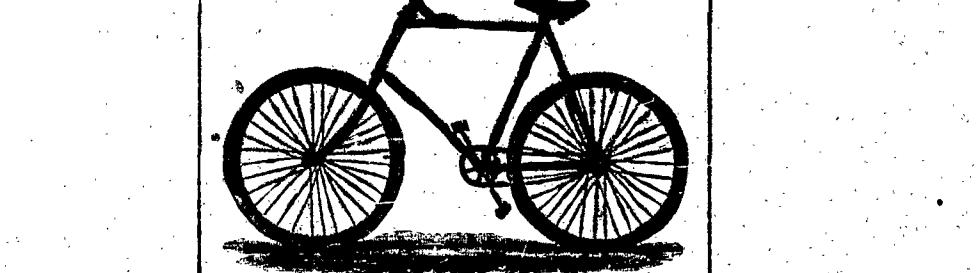
