TORTURED BY ROBBERS

Blakeslees Would Not Yield Up Their Money.

ROBBERS ROASTED THEIR FEET.

Pive Thousand Dollars Wore Finally Die covered and the Thieves Decamped. Leaving Their Victims Bound and Gagged-No Clue to

Their Identity.

TOLEDO, O., April 19.—Ten masked men broke into the house of Mrs. Rebecca Blakeslee, situated in Hancock county They were armed with clubs and torches. such as are used on the railroads by car inspectors, and, after inflicting what may be fatal wounds to John Blakeslee, a son, and torturing the other members of the family, got away with between \$5,600 and \$6,000 in cash.

Mrs. Blakeslee and her family are considered eccentric. They live on 400 acres of oil land quite a ways removed from any village. Recently Mrs. Blakeslee refused \$10,000 spot cash in gold for an oil lease on the farm. They kept all their money in the house. In the family were Mrs. Blakeslee, her daughter Eliza, and her two sons, Smith and John.

All were aroused by the breaking in of the door by the masked men. John was struck down and nearly killed by a blow from a heavy club. Another man gave Smith a blow on the head, which felled him to the floor. The women were overcome and bound. Thongs were used to fasten the arm- and feet of the men lest they should give trouble. Then a search of the house was made for money,

Not finding any money, the bandits returned to their captives and demanded to be told where the money was concealed. It was denied that there was money in the house. Then the men proceeded to torture their victims. The torches were applied to the feet of Mrs. Blakesles, her daughter and Smith. The feet were burned to a blister, yet the Blakeslees refused to admit of money being in the house. Mrs. Blakeslee lost consciousness, as did her daughter.

Finally the robbers ceased their torture and began another search of the premises and in one of the bureau drawers between \$5,000 and \$5 000 were found and carried

The house was to a terrible plight. About an hour after the men had gone, Elisa managed to work her hands loose, release the others and go for ald.
