
#### The Beautiful Trogon.

The trogon is one of the birds most sought after for millinery purposes, and, though it is now getting very scarce, its cousin, the trogon collaris, is still abundant.




ATHERA SCHOOL AND HALL



ST BRIDGET'S SCHOOL AND RECTORY




OUR LADY OF VICTORY SCHOOL.




