FEAST OF THE POPPIES One of the most beautiful customs of Mexico is the "feast of the Poppies," which is an annual celebration that takes place the Thursday after Easter. and hence is called "Poppy Thursday."

In the churchyard this year were do vout Indians, who had brought of theh treasures. Poppies with oak leaves, it wreaths and bunches, decorated the walls and facade of the quaint old building in which converts were made before the first colonists had arrived in New England. There were poppy laden booths, and Indian folk, men and women, young people and babies, sat on the ground with their brillian wares spread around them. In each corner of the yard was a pretty flower decked altar to Our Lady of Carmel and to these the Indians lovingly brought more of their fragile offerings There seemed to be scores of thousands of poppies, red. pink ones, and white.

In the church was a wealth of the same flowers. In the dome over the altar were men and boys, and when the first notes of the "Gloria in Excelsis" rang out a fairylike cloud of pinl and white and red petals floated from dome and choir gallery. It was like a snowstorm of exquisite beauty, and coloring of the walls and altar-red blue, gold and white-took an adder richness as seen through the poppy cloud. 
