THE NEW CARDINALS.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE SACRED COLLEGE BY HIS HOLINESS.

Pope Leo XIII Deplores the Present Conditions That Confront the Church in Europe and Has Grave Fears for the Future.

At the secret consistory held in the Vatican on April 15 Archbishop Martinelli, the papal delegate in the United States, was preconized a cardinal. The names of other new cardinals are as follows: Mgr. Frisetti, Mgr. Cabagna, Mgr. San Miniato, Mgr. Ceunari, Mgr. Della Voce, the archbishop of Benevento, the archbishop of Ferrara, the archbishop of Prague, the archbishop of Cracow, the bishop of Verona and the bishop of Pavia.

The pope in his allocution said that sad and dangerous events had come to pass and were becoming more serious and spreading from one part of Europe to another. Several states widely separated, but united by an identical desire, had entered into open war against religion.

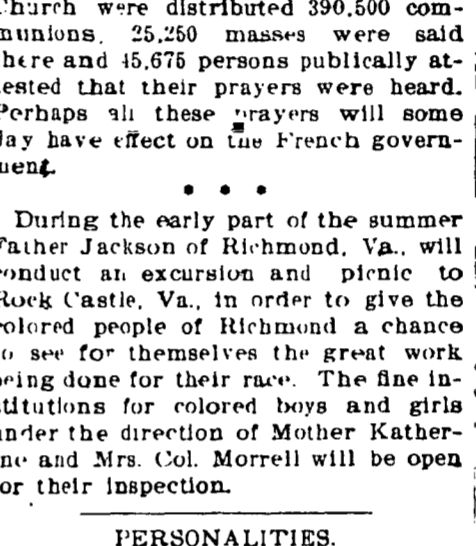
