The Age Passing Through Darkness Into Light.

A striking lecture on the religious outlook was that delivered a few days ago by Father Morgan M. Sheedy, at the Catholic Summer School. All familiar with the works of Father Sheedy know him to be one of the deep thinkers of the country, far-speing and conservative, yet possessed of an ardor that uplifts and urges forward. 
