One of the most delightful features incidental with the Institute was the reception given by Father Dougherty, pastor of St. Agnes church.

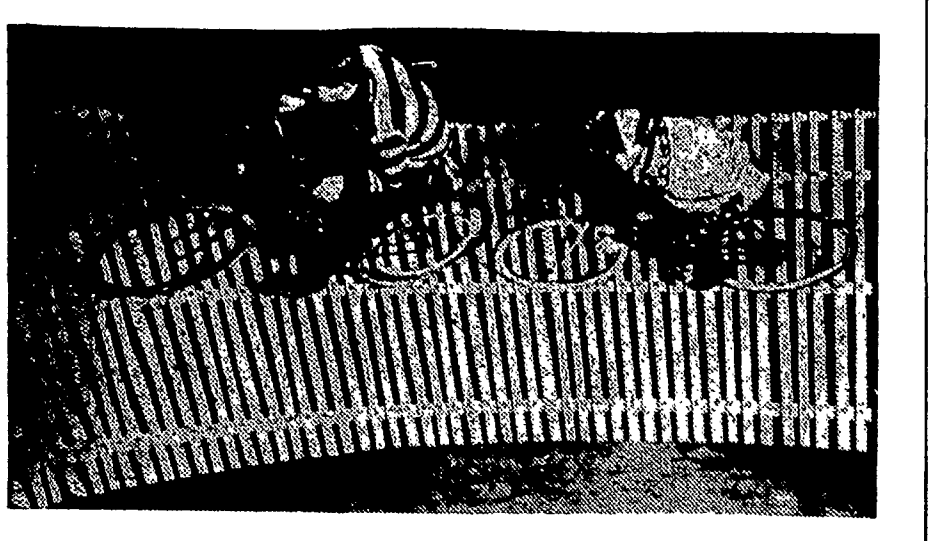
