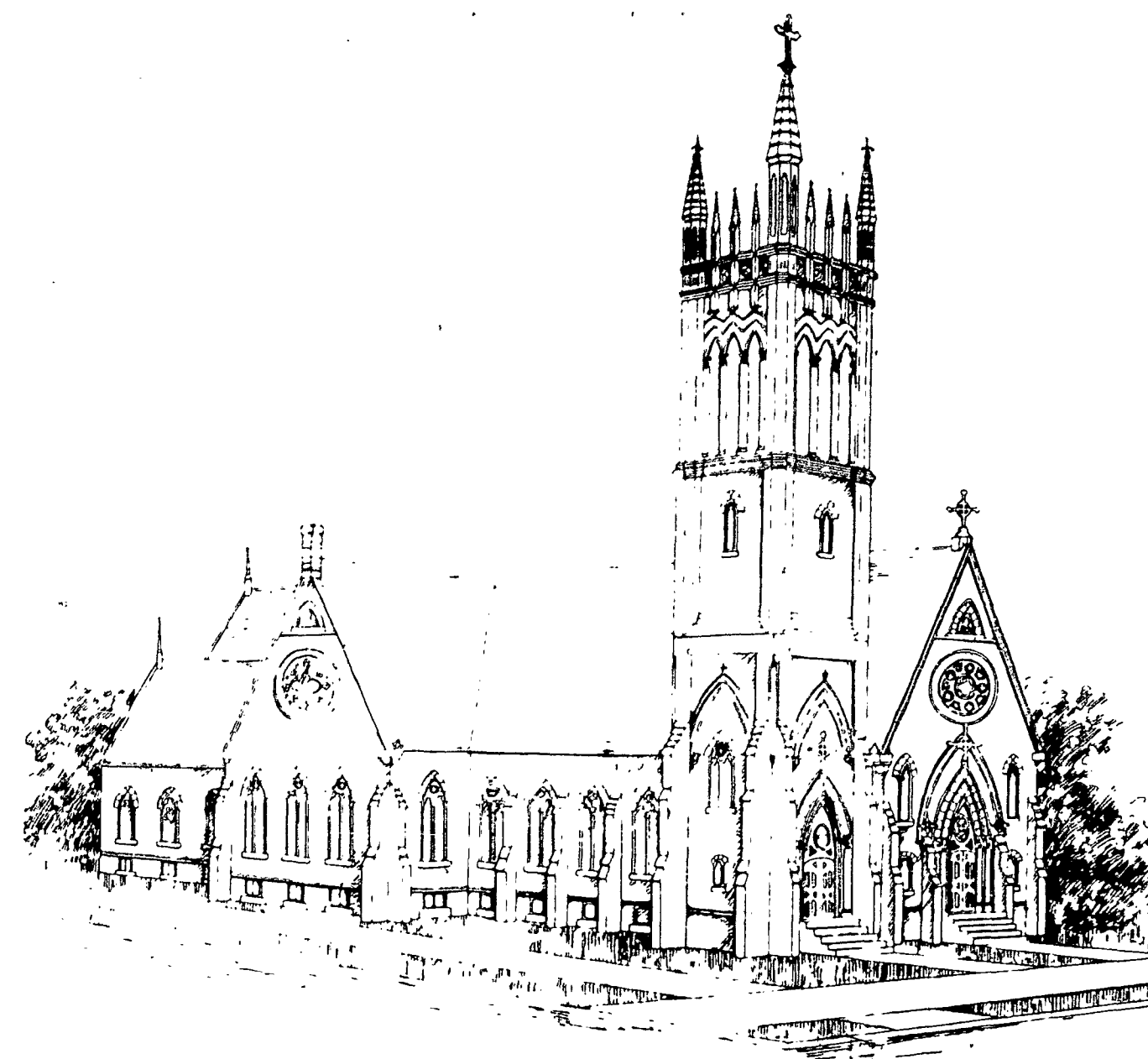

IMPRESSIVE CEREMONY OF DEDICATION AT PENN. YAN.

The new St. Michael's Church at Penn Yan, was formally dedicated by Rt. Rev. Bernard J. McQuaid, Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, last Sunday.

Solemn high mass was celebrated by Rev. Thomas Hendrick, with Rev. Jos. Hendrick as deacon, Rev. Ludlow Lapham as sub-deacon, and Rev. Jeremiah Malley as master of ceremonies.

Rev. Martin Hendrick became pastor of the church in 1899, and has since continued its pastor. The erection of the new church is due in the main to his efforts.
