His Reasons For Leaving the Anglican Church For That of the Holy Roman Catholic Church.

An "Apologia" in Brief.

The Oratory, July 3, 1871. My dear Mrs. H— As to your question, suggested by your friends, it is not at all the case that I left the Anglican Church from despair—but for two reasons concurrent, as I have stated in my Apologia first, which I felt before any strong act had been taken against the Tracts or me, namely in 1849 that the Anglican Church was in the position of the Arian Churches of the fourth century, and the Monophysite Churches of the fifth and this was such a shock to me that I at once made arrangements for giving up the editorship of The British Critic, and in no long time I contemplated giving up St. Mary's. This shock was the cause of my writing No. 90, which excited so much indignation No. 90, which aroused the Protestant world against me, most likely never would have been written except for this shock.
