The partition of the Roman Catholic archdiocese of Chicago by the creation of one or two more dioceses in the province of Illinois is said to be under consideration by the local church authorities, says the Chicago Tribune.

FATHER STEPHEN BADIN.

He Was the First Catholic Priest Ordained in the United States.

Father Stephen Badin, the first priest ordained in the United States, was one of the most remarkable men of his day.

On May 25, 1793, he was ordained by Bishop John Carroll at Baltimore, having the honor of being the first priest ordained in the United States.

At the time of his arrival Kentucky scarcely contained 300 families, all widely scattered. He saw the church increase marvelously, and much of its increase was due to his effort.

Even then, aged as he was, occasionally he made short visits to such "country parishes" as Hamilton, Columbus, Somerset and Zanesville.
