ST. FRANCIS XAVIER.

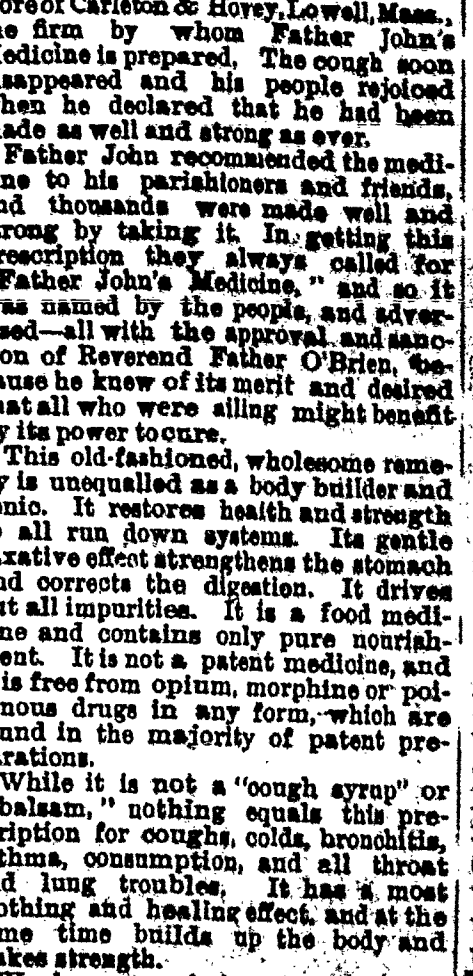
The members of the choir wish to extend their heartfelt sympathy to Frank Lampert on the death of his beloved wife. They will have a requiem mass read for the repose of her soul.
