STATE CONVENTION OF KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS TO BE HELD HERE

Delegates of Two Hundred Councils to Meet Here on May 5th and 6th.

Elaborate Bill to be Held at State Armory—Special Entertainment for the Ladies.

The annual convention of the state council of Knights of Columbus, will be held in Rochester on May 5th and 6th. The gathering promises to be a large one and will be attended by from 500 to 600 delegates representing the 200 councils of the state. The sessions will be held in Colonial Hall. Much business of importance to the order will be transacted. Officers for the ensuing year will be elected, delegates will be chosen to the national convention of the order and annual reports of officers will be presented.

On Tuesday morning, May 5th, high mass will be celebrated at St. Mary's Church, on South Street, at 9:30 o'clock for the members of the Order, officers and delegates attending the convention. Officers, delegates and members of the Order are earnestly requested to meet at Colonial Hall on St. Paul Street, at 9 o'clock, A. M., and proceed to the church in a body. Members of the Rochester Council will act as an escort to the delegates and it is desired that the Reverend clergy, members of the Order in attendance will be present in the sanctuary.

On Tuesday evening, May 5th, Rochester Council will tender a reception and ball to the officers, delegates and members of the Order and their ladies at the New York State Armory on Washington Square, at 8:30 o'clock P. M., for which extensive preparations have been made. Admission to the reception and ball will be by the Third Degree pass word at the door by members which will admit members and ladies accompanying them.

This function promises to be one of the most elaborate ever held in Rochester. Music for the occasion will be furnished by Herman Dusembach's orchestra and the Fifty-Fourth Regiment Band.

Open houses will be kept during the convention at the Union Club's spacious quarters in the Triangle building, this club being the social side of Rochester Council.

The entertainment committee and ladies committees will entertain the visiting ladies with a trolley ride to the State Industrial School on Tuesday afternoon, where the boys will give an exhibition drill, on Wednesday afternoon a trolley ride to Highland Park and Charlotte will be provided and in the evening a reception will be held at the Union Club rooms.

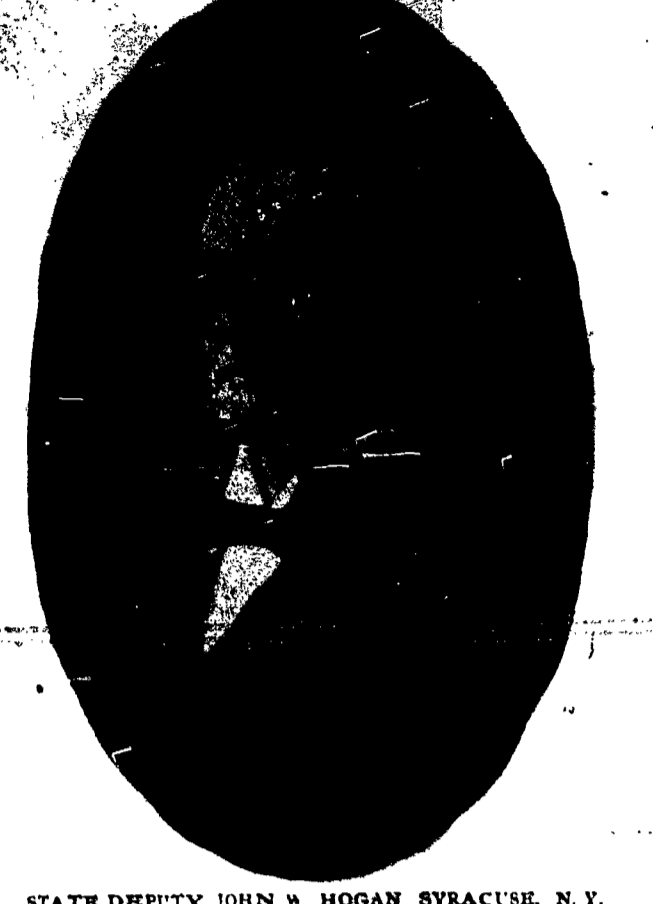
COOK OPERA HOUSE.

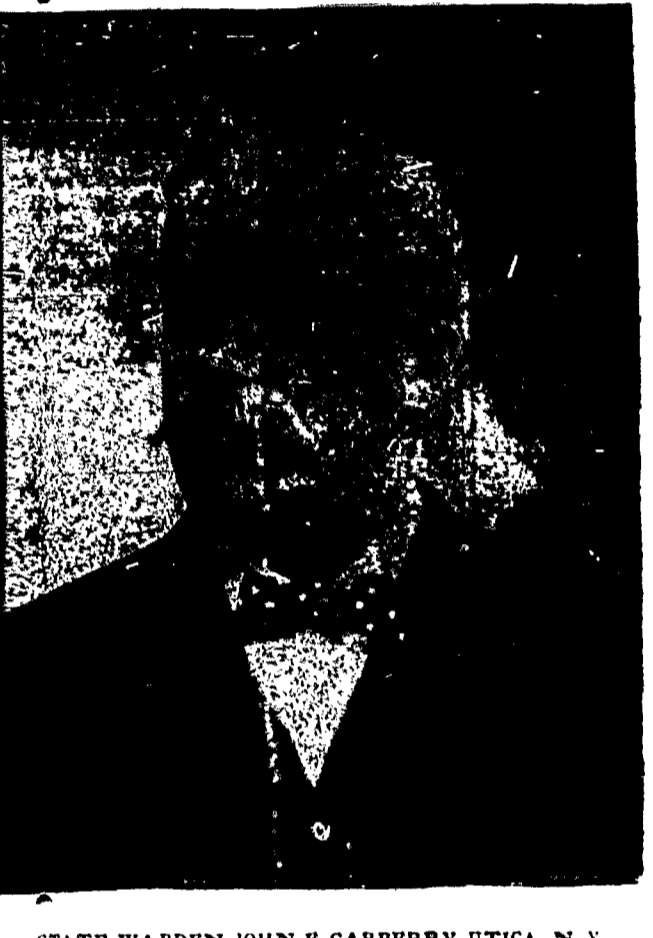
MRS. FISKE AT COOK'S. A minstrel show will be given by the attraction of the house for their benefit on May 9th.

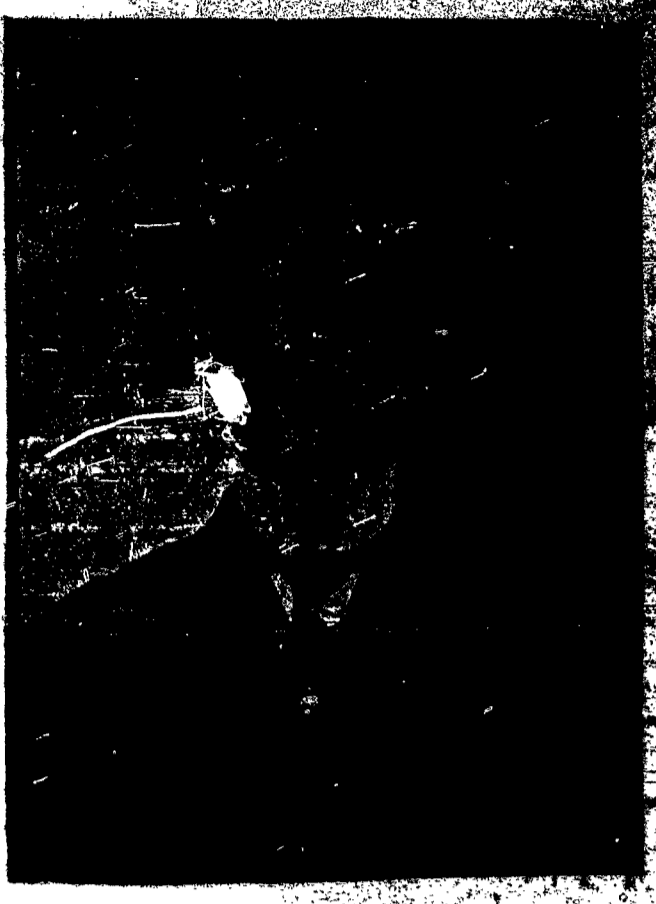
STATE DEPUTY JOHN W. HOGAN, SYRACUSE, N. Y.



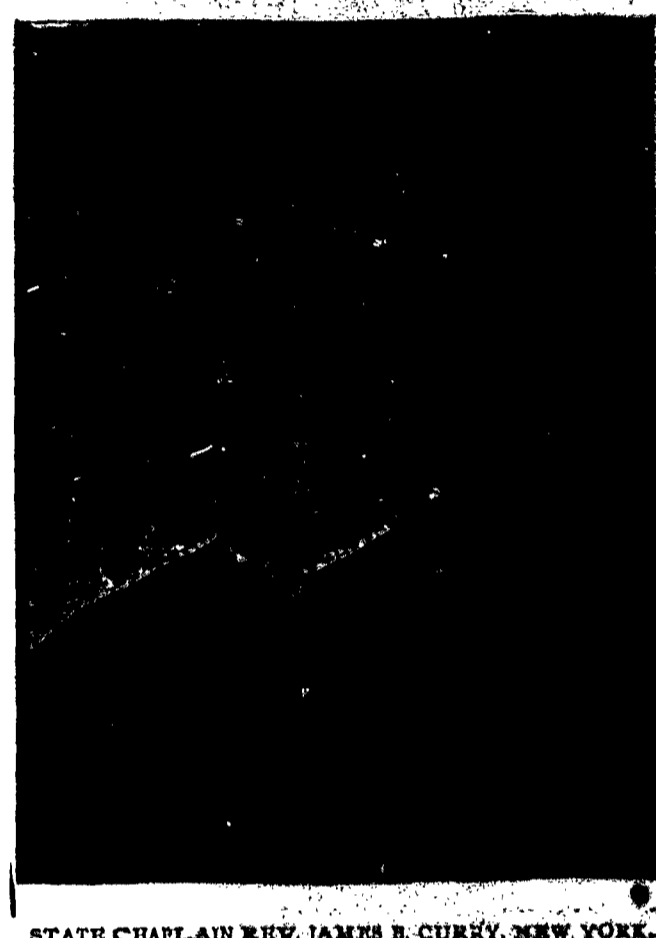
STATE WARDEN JOHN E. CARBERRY, UTICA, N. Y.



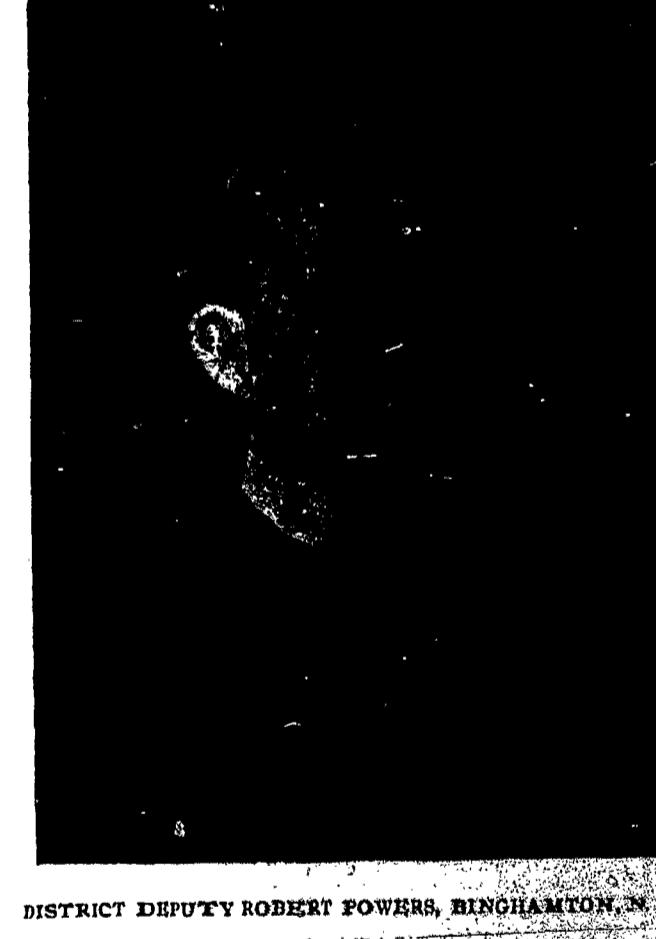
PAST STATE DEPUTY JOHN J. DELANEY, NEW YORK.



STATE SECRETARY NICHOLAS I. CLARK, BROOKLYN.



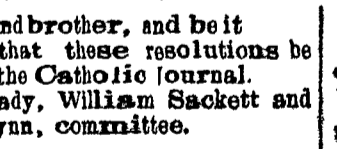
