NEW DOMINICAN SEMINARY.

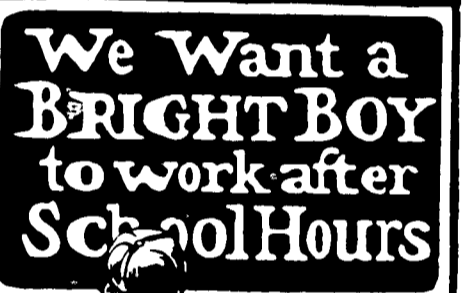
