Key to last week's puzzles:

No. 1—Turn left side of picture down. First squirrel is in lower left hand corner of picture, outlined by branches of tree. Second is in top of picture in left upper corner. Invert picture. Third squirrel is formed by woman's hat.

No. 2—Invert picture. Hidden duck is outlined by back and head of duck on bank of pond. Its head is between first duck's head and fence post immediately above.

No. 3—Turn left side of picture down. Girl's head is between bucket and border of picture. Invert picture. Donkey's head is outlined by man's right arm, face and hat.

No. 4—Turn right side of picture down. Lamb's head is in an angle formed by man's right arm and his body, just above handle bar of bicycle. Invert picture. Pig is between head of bicycle and right side of picture when thus held. Its head and neck are outlined by wheel.

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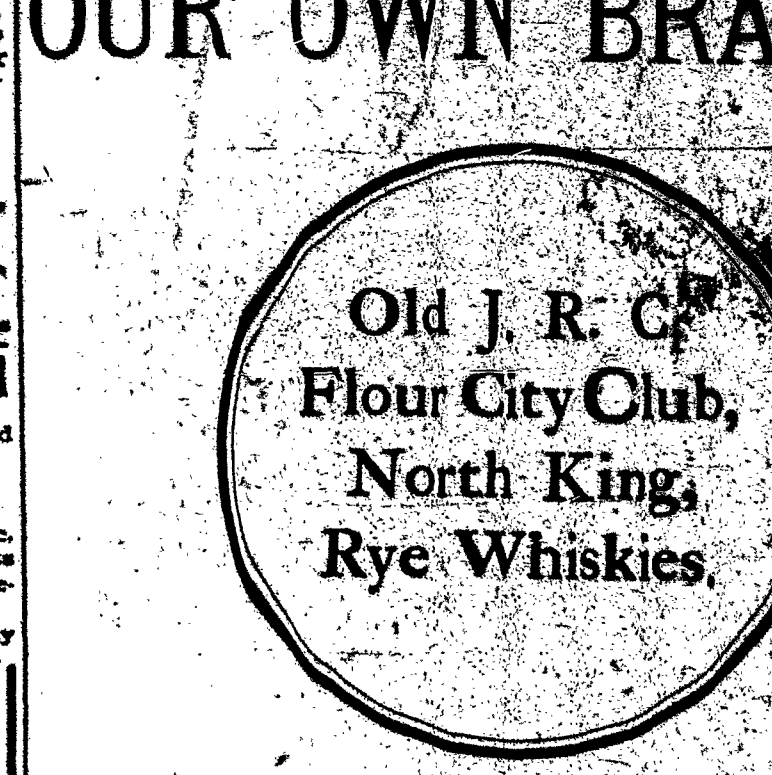
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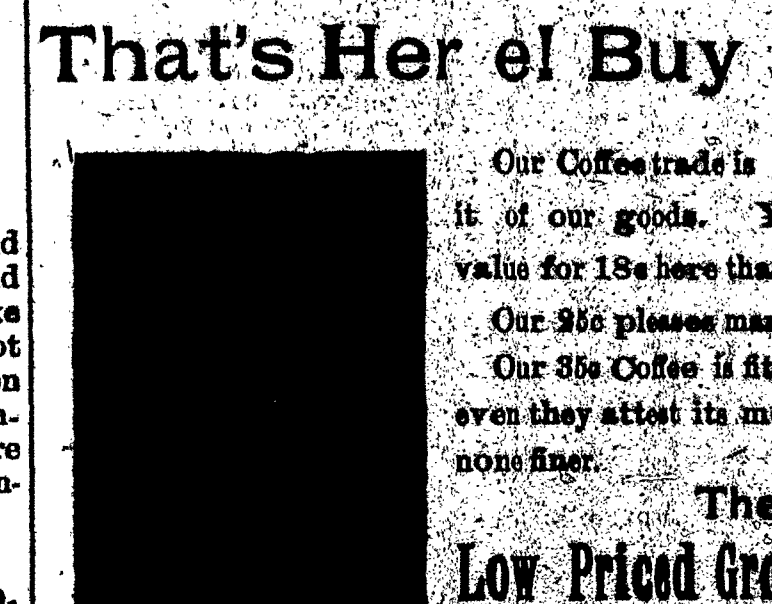
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
