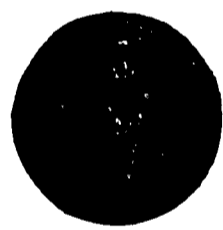

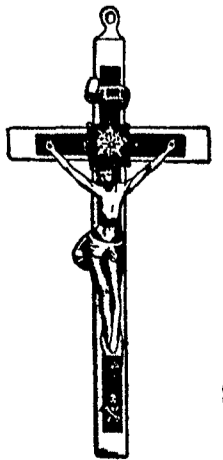

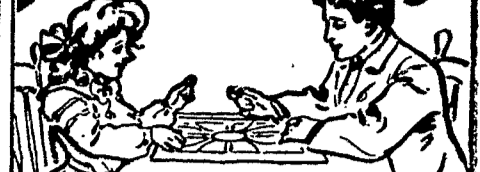
BAKER THEATRE.
