

A Child of the Diocese.



He is a native of Rochester, was educated in the Catholic schools here, in St. Andrew's and in the old St. Joseph's archdiocesan seminaries in Troy. He was ordained in the Cathedral where he was Wednesday consecrated as coadjutor bishop of the diocese by Bishop McQuaid, the senior assistant consecrator in Wednesday's ceremony.

The latte watched his career as an assistant pastor, as a country pastor at Moravia, as Catholic chaplain at the State Industrial school, as rector of the Cathedral, as vicar-general of the diocese.
