ICE A NON-CONDUCTOR.

mple Plan for Dispensing With Ordinary Insulation.

Ice is an almost perfect non-confactor of electricity. In this connection a prominent engineer has suggested the use of a pipe of metal for an electrical conductor. It would be immersed in a subway kept filled with water and through it cold brine from a freezing machine would be Allowed to circulate. This would freeze the water in contact with the pipe, thereby insulating it. The brine socald be used in supplying artificial cold to refrigerators in stores, marhets, or even in private houses.

The simplicity of the project and the complete dispensing with ordimary insulation are very striking.

Power from Long Distance.

Among the applications of power at iong distance from its source is the ighting of the interior passages and mmbers of the Great Pyramids by sectric currents generated at the staract of Assount, severals humfred miles away. The same power is intended to operate pumping stations and cotton mills along the Nile. In Same Francisco it is proposed to obtaim 10,000 horse power, for use in that city, from the water now runto waste on the slopes of the Serra Nevada Mountains, 110 miles distant. •







