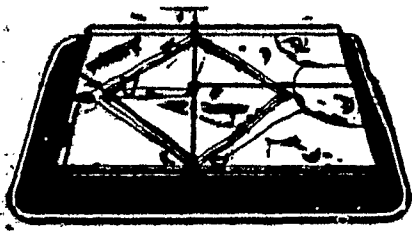


FASCINATING TOYLAND

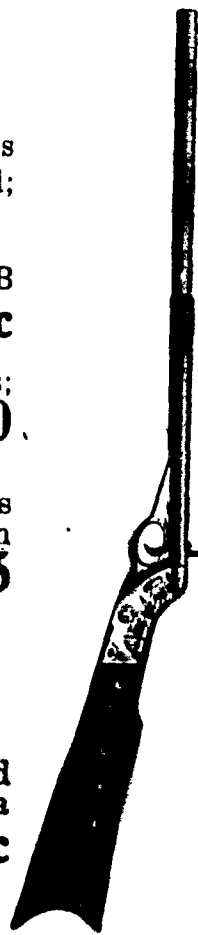

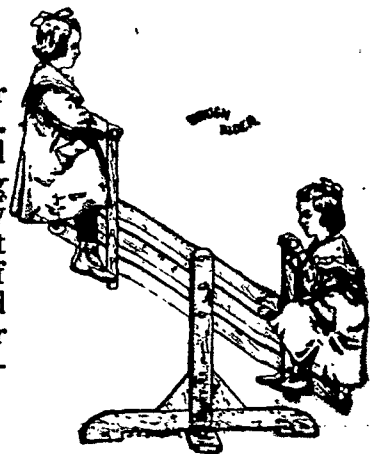

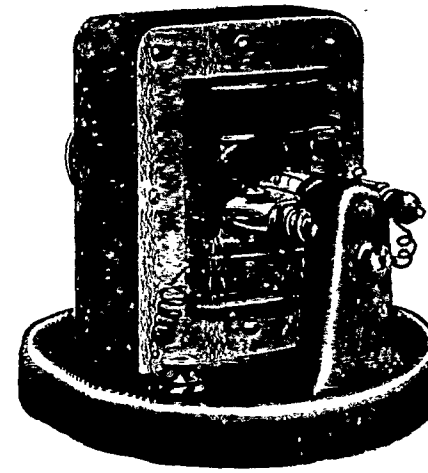

For ten days more Dr. Kime will continue to make all examinations free and if glasses are needed sell a gold filled frame with lenses fitted to the eye for \$1.

As the usual price of these glasses is about \$5, it is predicted that the doctor will be kept quite busy for the next ten days at least. However, he has made arrangements for this and is prepared to handle a great many people.

It is advisable to go as soon as possible and not to wait until the closing days and perhaps be disappointed, for without doubt the number of people who will take advantage of this offer now will be as great, if not greater as in the past.

The doctor's office hours are from 9 to 12; 1:30 to 5, Thursday and Saturday evenings 7 to 8.
