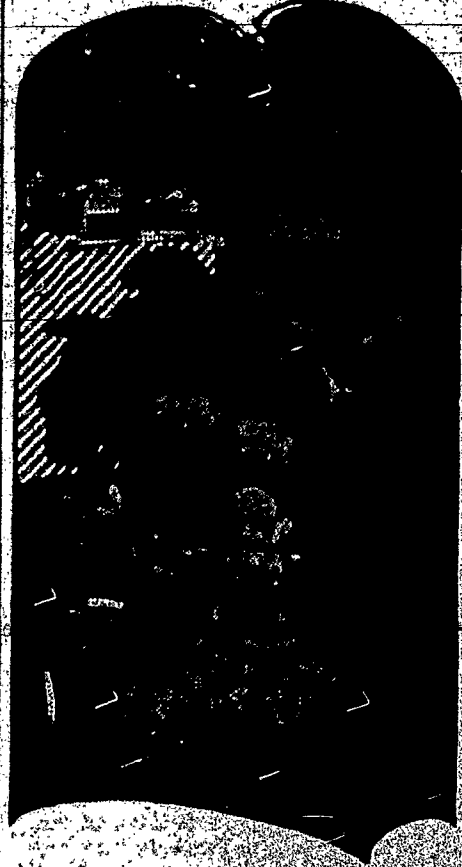
## An Xmas Mistake
