SEAL OF NEW YORK, OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE, Albany, July 25, 1908. Pursuant to the provisions of section one of article thirteen of the Constitution of the State of New York, and section seven of chapter nine hundred and nine of the Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-six, notice is hereby given that the following proposed amendment to section seven of article six of the Constitution of the State of New York is referred to the Legislature to be considered at the next General Election of Senators in this State to be held on the third day of November, nineteen hundred and eight, and is published once a week for three months next preceding such General Election in conformity with the provisions of section seven of chapter nine hundred and nine of the Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-six.
