NOVEL VENTILATION SYSTEM

Experiments Have Demonstrated Its Efficiency.

Attention was drawn to this important question at the recent congress of medical officers by The Hon. G. Lyon M. D., who made several interesting suggestions concerning the possibility of fresh air in ways and every where.

Dr. Lyon, after four experiments, developed a system of ventilation of the home, draught or expeller, and the expense of this system has been demonstrated.

The presence of medical officers at the congress and the fact that a system has been put into practice in the Government buildings, is a strong recommendation of the system.

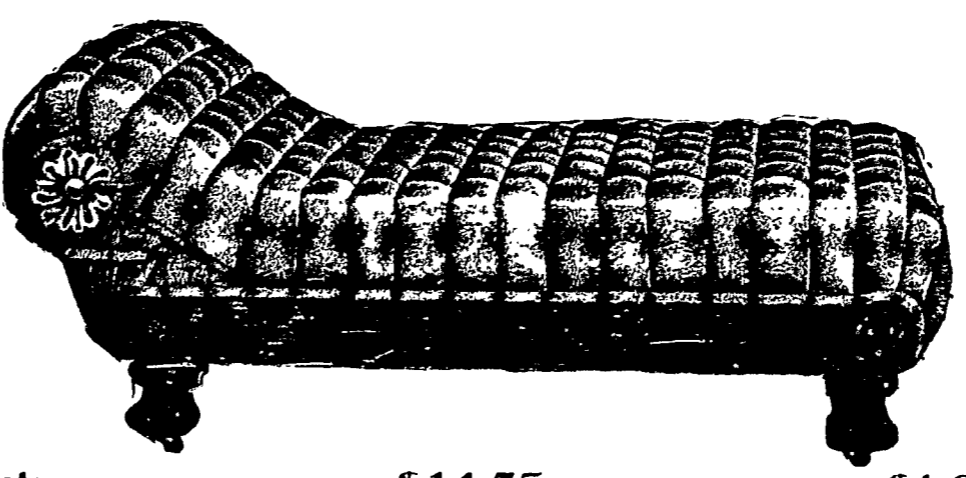

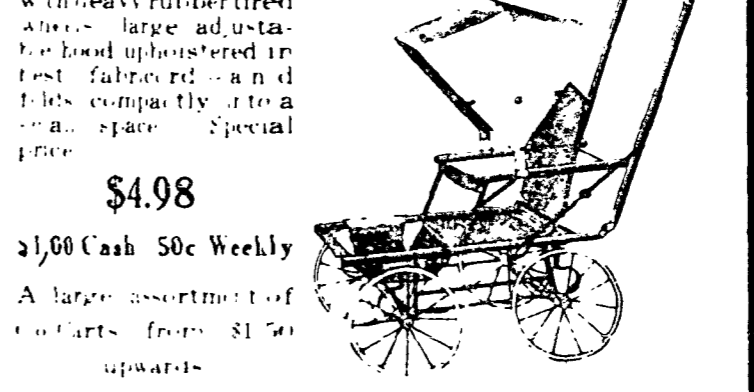
