PRESIDENT BUCHANAN'S DAY OF FASTING.

The first general proclamation appointing a fast day was issued by President James Buchanan Dec 14, 1860 and reads as follows:

Numerous appeals have been made to me by pious and patriotic associations and citizens. In view of the present distracted and dangerous condition of our country to recommend that a day be set apart for humiliation, fasting and prayer throughout the Union. In compliance with their request and in a sense of duty I designate the 14th day of January 1861 for this purpose and recommend that the people assemble on that day according to the general forms of worship, keep it as a solemn fast.
