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PRESIDENT BUCHANAN'S DAY OF FASTING.

The first general proclamation appointing a fast day was issued by President James Buchanan Dec. 14, 1860 and reads as follows:

Numerous appeals have been made to me by pious and patriotic associations and citizens. In view of the present distracted and dangerous condition of our country to recommend that a day be set apart for humiliation, fasting and prayer throughout the Union. In compliance with their request and my sense of duty I designate the 14th day of January 1861 for this purpose and recommend that the people assemble on that day according to the general forms of worship kept in use in their churches.

The Union of the States is at the present moment surrounded with a gloom and darkness of a character that is distressing to all hearts. The distress is of a deep and character that pervades the land. Our people are separated by the passions of the moment and the means for their reconciliation are being sought in vain. The day of fasting and prayer is a day of humiliation and the West is a land of mourning and grief.
