Cuba Women Possess For a New
Statue of Liberty For Cuba—Work
of Italian Sculptor Unveiled at Matanzas—Has Been at Work on Statue
For More Than Two Years.

Cuba is to have a statue of Liberty at Matanzas, for which a Cuban woman has posed.

Salvatore Bueini of Rome, an Italian sculptor, who executed the figure which will stand in a public park facing the harbor, left this city recently for Matanzas to arrange for the dedication of the monument.

In addition to the bronze figure representing Liberty which will rest on a granite pedestal the bronze image of Jose Marti will form a part of the same monument which is being erected by a popular subscription. The statue will stand 12 feet high and will be at the foot of the Marti monument.

FIRELESS COOKING.

Do not Leave Things in the Box Too Long Nor Put Them in Too Soon.

In fireless cooking there are certain things to be remembered by the experienced cook. One is that the dish is left indefinitely in the cooker and such things must be removed after twenty-four hours, and less in hot weather.

Another thing is that some foods require a longer time on the fireless cooker.



fore being put in the cooker than others do. According to Harper's Bazar cereals may take only ten minutes and tough meat half an hour; it is best to find out something about the length of time the different things require before beginning to use the cooker.

Generally speaking all indigestible things take longer than the rest, and meat of stew, corned beef and such need more time than stews and soups.

It is a good thing to remember is that the cooker takes a very long time to heat up and the process is hastened if when the time is half over the food is stirred and the pan is removed and reheated without opening the lid and put back again.

In fireless cooking also you must be careful not to uncover the pan with the lid off before putting it in the box. It is best to keep the lid covered until the time is put on the cooker. The steam will escape and the food will be cooked so that it cannot be put everything in as quickly as possible and cover at once.

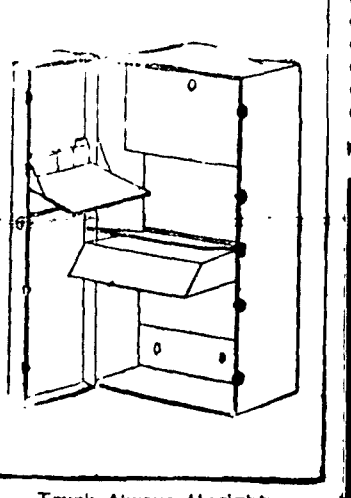

To Stern Currants and Gooseberries.
When green currants are to be stemmed, as soon as brought from the bushes, while crisp, take up a handful and rub between the hands over a pan, briskly. The few that do not come off can be quickly removed and the stems thrown away. Should any stems fall into the pan remove after each handful has been cleaned, and in this way a large quantity can soon be stemmed in a short time. Even when partially ripened they can be treated in the same manner. Gooseberries, while fresh and crisp can be put in a flour sack and rubbed on a washboard to remove stems and bones. Have the sack no more than half full. There will be a few stems left on which can be quickly removed when looking them over. Mrs. E. H. H.

Add pinch of salt to water and boil for five minutes. Take from water, plunge instantly into cold water. Leave until thoroughly cold, then spread on a platter put in a cold place, as it should be served cold. For more recipes see "The Art of Cookery."

Place it in a wire sieve or colander over a pan of boiling water. If all the dirt is not removed, it can be rubbed out or put through the food chopper.

A clean cloth dipped in hot water, then a saucer of bran, will speedily clean white paint without injury to it. The soft bran acts like soap on the dirt.

Frozen Fruit Custard.
Three pints of sweet milk, eight eggs, one teaspoonful of vanilla, one and one-half spoons of sugar, one cupful of raisins, one-half cupful of pecans, chopped fine, one-third cupful of citron, or candied orange peel.
Directions: Beat the three pints of sweet milk in the hot milk and slowly beat in the eggs and add one cupful of sugar, one and one-half spoons of vanilla, and one cupful of raisins, and stir into the milk, boil three minutes with one spoonful of vanilla, and set aside to cool. When cold put into a freezer pack with crushed ice and salt, when almost frozen add the fruits and nuts and set aside to harden. This quantity will serve twelve people.—Alice Riggs Blanton, Frankfort, Ky.
