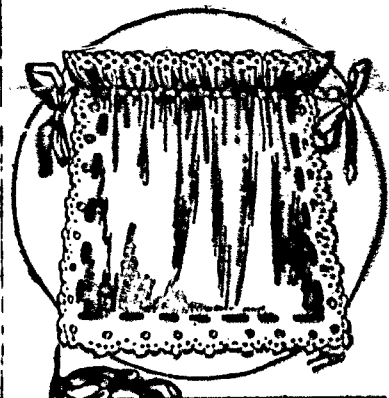

**GIFTS**  
Suggestions About Hand Wrought Jewelry—Ingenious and Useful Handkerchief Case—Novel and Attractive Waist Hanger

Watch fobs are favorite presents to men from girls who are clever at designing and making hand wrought jewelry. Fobs of copper set with various stones, a pretty green stone, and mounted on tan wools of a heavy quality are very smart. It is a fashion, too, to have belt buckles made out of old watch cases and from old picture frames, not to mention charming girdles from old fashioned chased and fretwork napkin rings. The ring is cut into perpendicular strips, the strips being fastened together with silver chains in an ornamental design. Old coins are often joined together for dog collars, and quaint buttons are set in metal bands for fillets. There are only a few suggestions for girls who are interested in arts and crafts work.

**Useful Handkerchief Case.**  
A useful handkerchief case can be made by purchasing flowered ribbon with a satin edge. Get the ribbon the width of a handkerchief when it is folded into a square, allowing a little for the finish. Turn both ends over a little more than is required for a

pocket, handkerchief and crocheted the edge of the strip and of the two corners together to make the two pockets. Hem the edges and fold the pockets together for packing. This little case is particularly nice to carry one's handkerchiefs in when traveling.

**For the Woman Who Cooks.**  
Few women can resist the appeal of a dainty made apron. For sewing or at a chafing dish an apron is indispensable, and many persons like to wear one around the house at light tasks that do not require them to be enveloped in more serviceable aprons.

A dainty affair of this kind, one that would make a nice Christmas present, is so simple in construction that any one can develop it.

All that is needed is a square of thin material—Persian lawn, sheer satinet or the barred dimity. The size of the square can be varied from a yard to forty inches or even more, according to the height of the wearer and the desired length of the apron.

Make an inch wide hem on the four sides and hemstitch it on one or both edges of the draw threads. It is fastened.

Hold the square of you with a point at the bust line, and let the waist line shape it by several groups of fine lengthwise tucks to form a small bib top. On each side of the point are formed put ties of the material two inches and a half wide. These may be hemstitched all around or they can be hemmed on the edges and finished in a deep hemstitched hem at the bottom.

This dainty apron is capable of many variations. In addition to the hemstitching, a bowknot design can be worked in the corner that forms the bib and at the bottom corner directly below it, or the four corners can be embroidered, those opposite the bib line taking a smaller motif.

An individual touch can be given by hemstitching as described and working in the bib corner a large oval medallion with a monogram in the center. Touches of color could be introduced in the embroidery with good effect.

**A Novel Waist Hanger.**  
Here is a new shirt waist holder that is made by cutting white card-

board twenty-one inches in length and nine inches in depth in the form of the illustration. Cut a floral design from wall paper and paste on the front. Make two holes in the top for the baby ribbon loop, one yard being necessary, and the holder is completed.

**FOR YOUR WEALTHY FRIEND**

Articles of Small Cost That Are Sure to Make a Hit.  
The woman who wishes to make a present to a wealthy friend who has seemingly no need of anything you could afford to buy will be sure to make a hit if she makes her three or four protectors into which can be slipped delicate evening clothes.

Choose a close cheesecloth in any pretty, delicate color. A soft gray is fashionable and washes without fading. Trim the width of the material, doubling it across at the top and sewing the two sides and the bottom in a seam.

Cut a small hole in the middle of the top fold, and from it cut a straight slit about a yard long down the middle of the front piece. Bind around the hole and down each side of the slit with three-quarter inch white tape. The opening can be cut back and hemmed, if preferred, or can be contrasted with narrow wash ribbon in a contrasting color to the cheesecloth.

Fasten tapes at each side of the neck opening and about six inches apart to the bottom of the slit. If the covers are intended as gifts and if there are several women in a family it is a good idea to work three or four on the cheesecloth just below the opening. Use white mercerized cotton and pad well underneath to make the letters raised.

This marking is a convenience to tell whose frock the bag contains without opening it.

**For the Traveler.**  
A dainty convenience for traveling is a little safety pin case made of linen and embroidered in a conventional design.

Two pieces of stiff paper or cardboard are cut the size of the oval in the design, and one piece is for the cover of the case, the other for the back.

The design may be transferred to the linen by means of carbon paper and embroidered in a plain Kensington stitch. The poppy is red and the leaves green, with binding and bows of red ribbon.

Cover each side of the cardboard with the linen and stick on the ribbon binding. Two pieces of white canvas with a pleated edge are sewed to the cardboard in at the top to hold the safety pins. Pins of different sizes may be put into the channel, and a few black safety pins will be found useful.

It is an attractive little gift and would be thoroughly appreciated by women at home as well as by the traveler.

**Something For the Baby.**  
Something for the baby is one of the most important of Christmas gifts. A neighborhood ring will delight his young fancy. For it has gay ribbon, and when he shakes it the bells tinkle merrily.

A small embroidery hoop is worked tightly with ribbon, and five strands of the ribbon are stretched across the

hoop. A bow of the ribbon finishes where the strands are sewed on, and a bell is sewed to the other end.

A practical idea is to take a hoop from a butter tub, make patches in the wood and tie it together tightly before winding with the ribbon.

It takes only a few minutes to make the ring, and the ribbon and bells are inexpensive. Any one who has a few moments to spare might make half a dozen or so and send them to some children's home or hospital, for there is always sure to be some very needy ones there.

**Table Cover Design.**  
An attractive design for a table cover may be carried out in starch and embroidery. A model was developed in monk's cloth of a warm tan shade stencilled in peacock blue and orange outlined in deeper shades of the same color. Tapestry dyes for stenciling may be bought in any shop selling art materials. Where the desired shade cannot be purchased it is easily obtained by mixing the
