

To Legalize Tipping.

While praiseworthy attempts are being made in London to minimize the tipping system, a movement has been started in Berlin to make the custom compulsory. The cafe waiters in the Kaiser's capital have formed themselves into a union with the object of legalizing tipping. They have drawn up a scale of tips and passing resolutions to enforce it. If the order s customer gives in a restaurant amounts to three shillings he will be expected to tip the waiter to the time of 12 per cent. If the order to over three shillings the "kellper" will be content with a tip of 10 per cent. In the larger restaurants the waiter will be satisfied with a modest 8 per cont. tip if the bill amounts to £5. The restaurant keepers protest against this tariff of tips, which they consider will interfere with their business, but the waiters refuse to give way .- The
