Immigration. There is that of interest for Catholics in the report of United States Commissioner of Emigration Parker for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1909, and just issued.

As in past years, a great majority of the immigrants coming to our shores, were from Catholic countries. Of the 654,000 who arrived during the year ending June 30, 1909, Austria-Hungary sent 170,000 and Italy 183,000. One thing added to these 25,000 from Portugal, 10,000 from France, Spain, Portugal and Belgium, and the total from Catholic countries alone is 396,000. If we add to these the Catholic Germans, and Poles probably it would be safe to classify as Catholics 440,000 of last year's 654,000 immigrants.

This pleasing information is conveyed by the Catholic News of New York. Following the example of the medical fraternity at this who have recently formed St. Luke's Guild for Catholic Physicists, they are more the headquarters of the association, the main objects of which are to promote the intellectual and social relations of thousands of men who are members, to encourage regularity in the holy communion quarterly with the Holy Name societies, and to provide a relief fund for nurses.

The Toledo Record says that 'this is a splendid testimonial to the thoroughness and efficiency of the work of the teachers in our parochial schools and our academies.'

The A. O. H. Wins. Vigorous protest on the part of the ancient Order of Hibernians, which organization had much to do with the project, the objectionable models for the statue of Commodore John Barry to be erected in Franklin Square, Washington, have been rejected. When models were submitted originally that of Edward O'Connor of Paris was regarded by the members of the commission as most satisfactory. It consisted of a symbolic group of several nude female figures, which proved distasteful to the Ancient Order of Hibernians, who protested on the ground that Mr. O'Connor's model was inappropriate. He was permitted to submit a second model, which also proved unsatisfactory.

The Congregation of Rites has approved the text for the office of the commission Secretary of War and mass of Blessed Joan of Arc whose feast we celebrate on the first Sunday after Ascension day. The office is considered one of the most appropriate and best written in recent years. Very likely the case for the canonization of Joan of Arc will be introduced some time in April.

The Cardinal McCloskey centenary has been postponed until next September when, it is hoped the Eucharistic Congress delegates will be present.

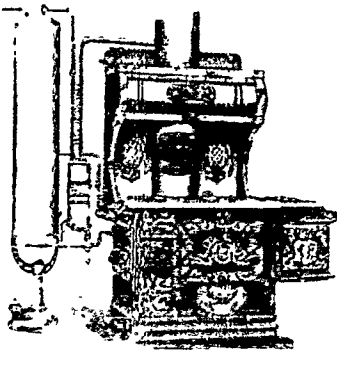
