

It burns with a pale ame, similar to that from alcohol, if cated to about 300 degrees and them gnited. Its nonevaporative qualities nake the compound of much use as a chicle for holding pigments and colrs, as to stamping and typewriter ribions, carbon papers and the like,

If the pure glycerin be exposed for a ong time to a freezing temperature it rystallizes with the appearance of ugar candy, but these crystals being once melted it is almost an imposedbility to get them again into the com-genied state. If a little water be added to the glycerin no crystallization will take place, though under a suffilent degree of cold the water will separate and form crystals, amid when the glycerin will remain in its natural etate of finidity. If suddenly subjected to intense cold pure glycerin will form a gummy mass which cannot be entirely hardened or cristallized. Altogether it is quite a peculiar sub-
