The Holy Name Society held a most successful meeting last Sunday evening at the parish hall. A large number of new members were enlisted.

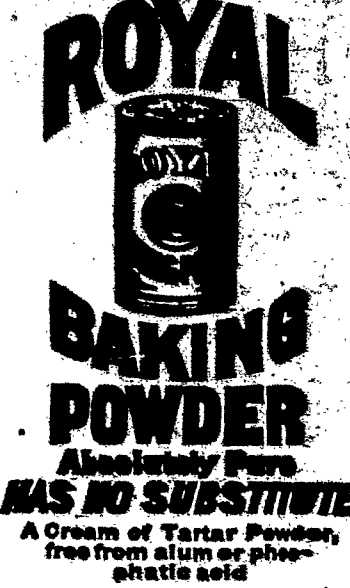
The "Wolverines" the famous young "Westonites" again walked the ties to Honeye Falls where they are camping for the summer.
