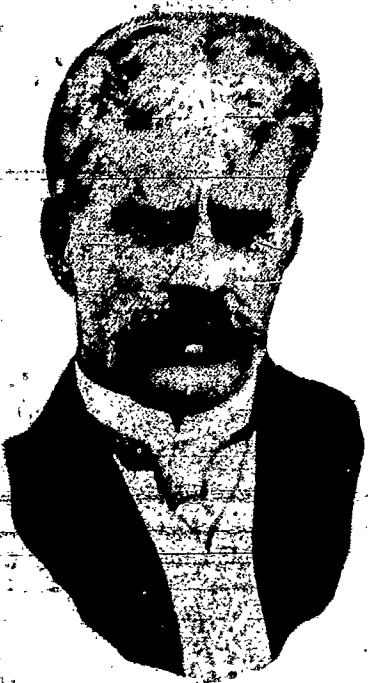


SNAPSHOTS AT CELEBRITIES

R. L. Borden, opposition leader of the recently dissolved Canadian house of commons, is head of the Conservative party in Canada.

"It is beyond doubt," said Mr. Borden, "that the leading public men of the United States, its leading press and the mass of its people believe an annexation of this Dominion to be the ultimate, inevitable and desirable result of this proposition and for that reason support it."

There could be but a sinister meaning, Mr. Borden affirmed, in President Taft's declaration that "Canada stands at the parting of the ways."

Robert Laird Borden, K. C., represents Halifax, N. S., in the Canadian parliament. He was born in Grand Fre, N. S., in 1854 and after graduating from Acadia University was professor in the Glenwood Institute, New Jersey.

James E. Vardaman, who recently won the primary election for United States senator from Mississippi, has been twice governor of the state.

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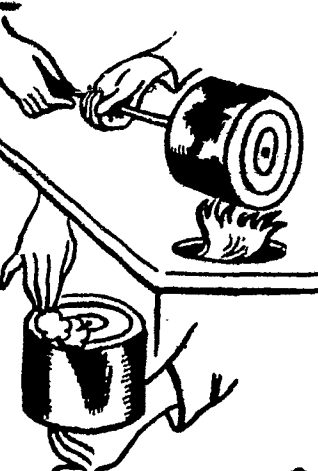
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HINTS FOR THE BUSY HOUSEWIFE
