Parasols With Cream. Take some nice fresh parasols, peel and wash them, then cut them into the shape of olives, using only the outside part for the purpose.

Compete of Rice With Peas. Wash two-thirds of a cupful of rice, add one cupful of boiling water and steam until the rice has absorbed the water.

Peach Jelly. Peel and stone a peck of peaches, slicing or cutting them, and add to them a dozen cracked peach pits.

Sweet Potatoes on Brochette. Wash and pare potatoes and cut in one-third inch slices. Arrange on skewers in groups of three or four.

Sweet Potatoes, Southern Style. Bake six medium sized sweet potatoes, remove from oven, cut in halves lengthwise and scoop out inside.
