Profanity is coming to be class-

connection the "Catholic News"

Scotland has had no direct rep-
resentation in the Sacred College
since Cardinal Beaton, who was
murdered by the reformers in
1546, but of her sons two others

—His Royal Highness, Henry
Benedict Stuart, sometimes,

1807, and Mgr. Charles Erskine,
of an exiled Jacobite family, who

cate died again an exile in Paris
in 1811. Though in deacon's or-
ders only, he was created Car-
dinal by Pope Pius VII in 1803.
He is best known in English an-
nals as Envoy of the Holy See
to the court of George III.

again have a representative in
the College of Cardinals in the
