The Harder Task. Senator Root at a reception at a Washington country club said of his own recitation on treaties: "I was too soon. The world is getting tired of war."

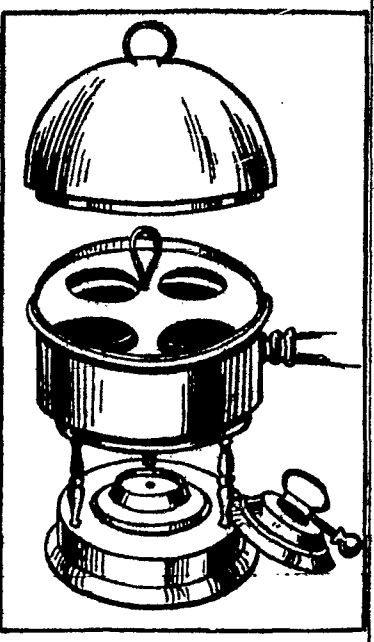
Helped. Mrs. White has been very watchful of her husband's diet lately and is in constant fear lest he overeat.
