St. Mary's Church.

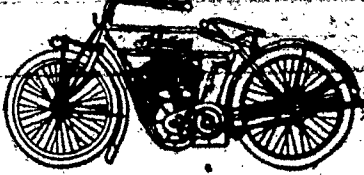

A fair was held at Sacred Heart parish hall all this week for the benefit of the church. It was a great financial success.

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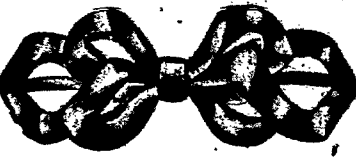

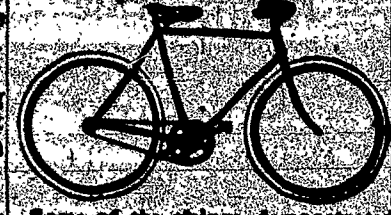
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
