Kts. of Columbus Convention

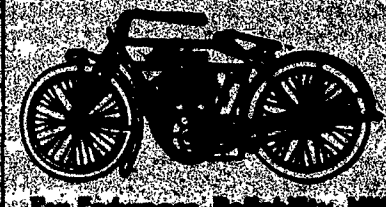

The reception and ball given by the Central Council of the Catholic Men's Benevolent Association at Convention Hall Tuesday evening was a grand success.

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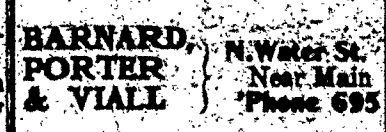

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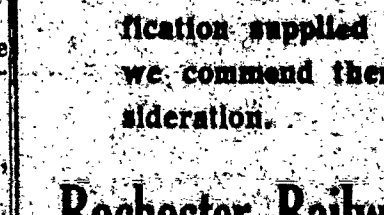
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
